### ADDITIONAL INFORMATION:

Should there be more qualified applicants than spaces available, general education coursework listed on the other side of this sheet completed prior to applying to the ADN program will be considered in the application process. It is strongly recommended that all general education classes listed on the other side of this sheet are completed at the time of application.

Once accepted (conditionally), a pre-enrollment assessment (TEAS) of basic math, reading, English, and science must be completed successfully in order to begin the program.

American Heart Association Health Care Provider card must be current throughout the program.

ALL NURADN courses listed in the boxes above must be completed with a minimum grade of C/Pass. Failure to follow the above sequence results in being dropped from the ADN program.

To be eligible to take the state examination for licensure as a registered nurse, the California Board of Registered Nursing requires a high school diploma or equivalent and successful completion of an accredited nursing program. There are fees and fingerprint requirements to obtain licensure by examination or endorsement, interim permit, and biennial renewal.

Students with any convictions, including no contest pleas, infractions, misdemeanors and felonies, should contact the Board of Registered Nursing regarding legal limitations for licensure. <a href="www.rn.ca.gov">www.rn.ca.gov</a> A criminal background check is required prior to entering NURADN 35.
