<b>4. RESIDENCE REQUIREMENT:</b> A minimum of 12 units must be earned at Chaffey College			
<b>5. CONTINUOUS ATTENDANCE:</b> The preceding graduation requirements apply to students during the 2021-2022 school year. Students who enrolled at Chaffey prior to Fall 2020 and who have maintained continuous attendance (attendance in at least one semester or two quarters, excluding Summer sessions, each calendar year - January 1 through December 31 - as indicated on a permanent record) at any accredited college, have the option of meeting the current requirements or those in effect at the time continuous attendance at Chaffey began. In the event that required courses have been discontinued, students may petition for course substitution by making an appointment with a counselor in the Counseling Department.
