10.1 Action Item: Endorsement of new Adjunct Senator-at-Large, 2020-2022

- **Motion for Approval** - Senator Fisher moved to endorse the new Adjunct Senator-at-Large, Patty Peoples to complete the current term. The consent agenda was seconded by Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick. The motion was approved. 9.28.21. 23Y/0N/0A.

10.2 Discussion Item: Men of color student success initiative, Mark Gutierrez

- This taskforce focuses efforts towards obtaining and retaining men of color, as current data is showcasing this population is currently being underserved, including survey data to collect where we are losing this population of students and how student services and faculty support can improve. The taskforce has met a few times, however Senator Gutierrez will be updating the Academic Senate as future progress is made. 10.3 Discussion Item: Instructional rationale for paid office hours for all adjuncts

- Streamlining this process is within the purview of the Academic Senate in response to #5 - Standards or policies regarding student preparation and success and #10 - Processes for institutional planning and budget development.
- What are some instructional rationale for opening up office hours for all adjuncts as compared to the application/first-come-first-served method that is currently in place?
 - Senator Doget mentioned the competitive disadvantage for individuals who are hired later in the semester. In addition, lab instructors could not apply since the FTEF did not meet the current requirements.
 - Some instructors that could apply have chosen not to, in order to leave the opportunities open to other instructors to be granted those hours.
 - Senator Glass mentioned the example of Mt. SAC including office hours into the hours allotted in to adjunct contracted pay. Senator Glass also mentioned that there might be some concerns regarding adjunct instructors not using those office hours, however those issues could be mitigated. Senator Glass mentioned as an adjunct that they have and current
 - Senator Cotton stated that office hours should be for everyone, and speaks to the equity issues for students and student support.
 - Senator Kern spoke in regard to instructional rationale in the ability to have office hours allow adjunct instructors to feel more invested in the Chaffey Community
 - Senator Holdiness stated there is a significant amount of importance for office hours. In their experience in the success centers, they hear of the issues surrounding the equity in terms of student success and office hours - frustrations regarding lack of office hours and access in comparison to other instructors they feel they have access to. Senator Holdiness stated that it impacts the professional support and student support aspects of the college.
 - Angela Ibarra, a student guest, stated that many students are aware that there are faculty who are full-time in regards to those faculty that have established offices on campus. While adjunct

faculty tended to have areas to host student meetings in various parts of campus that were inconsistent. In addition, Ibarra mentioned inconsistent responses via email to instructors and the responsibility of the instructors to help students achieve success in course. Ibarra listed a series of concerns from the student perspective in terms of access to instructors and barriers students face.

- Senator Jenkins mentioned that the workload for adjunct instructors is sometimes extremely high and that might interfere with their ability to host office hours.
- Senator E. Martinez mentioned that there might be concerns in obtaining additional work at another campus because of a required and scheduled office hour at a particular school.

At the September 7 meeting, the Academic Senate unanimously approved the establishment of an Ethnic Studies Department and the formation of a workgroup that will help to create an ethnic studies graduation requirement (to be compliant with Title 5, Section 55063).

On September 14, the Senators approved the launch of the Textbook Transformation Project. 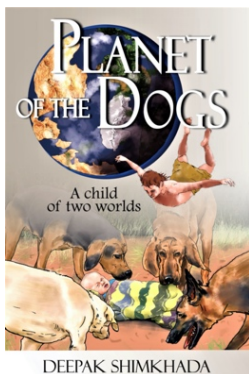
Dave Milbrandt (Political Science)

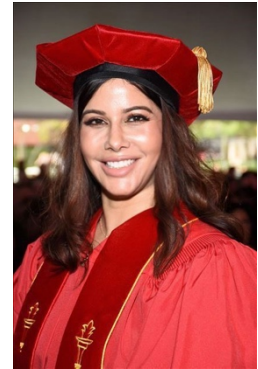

- Information/Data Security Training - Training for staff via the My Learning Hub will be ready within the next 30 days—Financial Aid and Student Services are a priority. Mike Fink and Eric Houck are working with HR on faculty training.
- Fraudulent Accounts/Phishing – Due to an increase in fraudulent accounts and phishing attempts, an external notification banner has been added on emails originating from non-chaffey.edu email addresses. Spoofed email messages that appear to be from a chaffey.edu account should not have the external notification banner—be sure to check the email header for the sending email address. Over 3,000 emails were purged in July. Two to three people per month respond to spoofed emails, and their accounts have to be disabled while IT investigates for malicious activity. This can take 24 hours or more. Please do not respond to emails that are questionable or seem to be phishing attempts.
