## 9. UNFINISHED BUSINESS \*10 minutes max

### 9.1 Discussion Item: Academic Senate Representation January 4 ACC/Area Meeting feedback

- The senators engaged in a robust discussion regarding the feedback received during the January 4th ACC/Area Meetings. Highlights are as follows:
  - Possibly increase adjunct senator-at-large representation. The number of senators in option 2 correspond to numbers of departments, not numbers of faculty members in each department. We have many small departments. Part-time faculty are being represented by their individual department senators as well as at-large senators.
  - Any increase in senator representation will increase quorum.
  - Confusion regarding senator duties. How do senators represent faculty? President DeRose remarked that the Academic Senate deals with academic and professional matters. Title 5 grants faculty the purview to make recommendations in areas like curriculum, student learning outcomes, professional development, faculty hiring, appointing faculty to serve on committees, etc.
  - Possibly increase counseling representation. Both units of counseling faculty and part-time faculty are larger in size than most departments. Two senators seem to have been working. What evidence suggests that a large unit is losing out on representation and would require an increase in representation?
  - If the number of senators increases because an ACC has more programs than other ACCs, then the larger ACCs will have a larger voice in the Academic Senate.
  - If an ACC has vacancies now and faculty don't want to fill the positions, why would those ACCs be offered more spots like in option 2?
  - The 10+2 are broad academic areas of faculty purview, nothing related specifically to programs. Increasing the number of senators for ACCs with lots of programs suggests that programs are in need of faculty representation. If the 10+2 are not program specific, why would ACCs with more programs need more representation?
  - For ACCs with three senators in option 2, will the senator terms for those ACCs become three years instead of two years? Currently, only the three full-time senator-at-large terms are 3 years (staggered). All other senator terms are two years (staggered).
  - How long will the terms be for ACCs with four senators in option 2? Would we want two of them to expire one year, and the other two expire another year?
  - If the terms are changed to three years for ACCs with three senators then the following areas of the Constitution will require amendments:
    - § Article IV Section 1
    - § Article IV Section 2
    - § Article V Section 3
  - Representation for situations where two schools merged into one ACC will be more complicated. Those ACC's can decide to assign one seat to each area. For example, for HWA one seat can be from Health Science and the other from Kinesiology.

- The Academic Senate may decide to move forward with only one of the options for the electorate to vote yes or no. Elections are conducted in March.

- Senator Johnson added that "unit" better represents areas like Instructional Support.
- **Motion for Approval** -Senator Chamberlain moved to amend the Constitutional Amendment to the Electorate to remove the word "school" from the Constitution and replace it with "unit." Senator Johnson seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 1.9.24, 20Y/0N/0A.

- Vice President Encarnacion said this resolution is well written, detailed, and well cited.
- Senator Holdiness said the number of staff positions should be 14 instead of 11. Also, why is the staffing exclusive to clerks, why not other classified professionals?
- Senator Boboye suggested Senator Holdiness assist the library faculty in revising the resolution.
- Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick suggested putting the requested positions in PSR.
- Senator Holdiness said that the Success Center has, for years, had unfilled classified professional positions and these Library concerns set a precedent to make a similar argument for the Success Center.
- Senator Overduin said that the core difference between the Library and the Success Center is the violation and non-compliance of Ed Code and Title 5.

# Academic Senate Resolution- Action Plan for Increasing Library Staffing in Accordance with Title 5

Whereas, the Academic Senate of California Community Colleges supports that “Librarians are central to education as they provide a safe and inclusive environment for students to bring questions about their courses, explore new ideas, and learn to become information literate in a quickly changing world,” [\[1\]](#) and research indicates library resources and instruction are related to improved student success and retention;

Whereas Chaffey College BP4040 states that the district will provide “library and learning support services that are an integral part of the institution’s educational program” [\[2\]](#);

Whereas the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs states, “The library is an educational facility [...] as such, it cannot operate without library faculty in place. A library, like a classroom, should not be in use unless library faculty are available to provide service and facilitate student learning” [\[3\]](#);

Whereas Chaffey College libraries have not been staffed in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724 [\[4\]](#) for at least 10 years, which sets forth the minimum staffing levels for certificated and classified staffing in libraries and media centers, and that the minimum number of staff for a library serving 13,000 FTES is 11.0 staff while Chaffey College Libraries have 5.0 staff;

Whereas libraries are required to have a certificated librarian present during all hours the library is open by Chaffey College AP 4040 [\[5\]](#), California Education Code [\[6\]](#), and the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs [\[3\]](#);

Whereas Chaffey College Administrative Procedure 4040 states that Chaffey College Library will comply with the California Code of Regulations [\[5\]](#);

Whereas Chaffey College is continually growing to include new locations, buildings, and services that need to be adequately staffed per regulations;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate advocates for an action plan to reach district compliance with the library staffing minimum standards set forward in California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724; such an action plan should be created by a work group comprised of library managers, library faculty, and library staff and finalized no later than Fall 2024;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate recommends that the district hire an additional 2.0 FTE classified library clerk II positions by Fall 2024 to work in good faith towards said compliance;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Libraries will not be opened nor remain open unless at least one (1) classified library clerk and one (1) library faculty are concurrently present in the building in accordance with said California regulations, CCC policies, and Chaffey College procedures.
