7. GUEST(S)/PRESENTATION(S) - Superintendent/President, Dr. Henry Shannon will discuss and answer questions with regard to Measure P, College Goals, Budget, and the Organizational Chart.

• Dr. Shannon expressed gratitude toward all faculty for working so hard to serve our students during these difficult times.

Senate asked questions of Dr. Shannon and Vice President Rosas that included:

Q: Has the executive committee decided to renovate the current ATL building or build a new ATL building?

A: The decision was made by the entire Measure P committee, not just the executive team. After looking at renovation costs, the group decided to build a new ATL building.

Q: Has moving most of our instruction online impacted our building plans with Measure P?

A: Yes, it has impacted our plans to some extent. We were looking at purchasing property in Ontario and have currently halted this purchase. Under Measure P, we have made a commitment to have college presence in Ontario. Hence, we're looking at purchasing a smaller site to reduce our environmental footprint. As far as the Fontana campus, the current location of the campus presents expansion problems because the neighboring properties have required too high of a price. We have bought land south of the 10 freeway and are in the early stages of the master plan for this site.

Dr. Shannon offered that the original plans were to build out on to the current Fontana campus, but the land surrounding that area is beyond the budget. The District purchased land just south of the 10 freeway at Sierra and Juniper. The District met with the City of Fontana manager to work out some small issues, but it will serve all the surrounding cities.

Q: Will the Fontana campus have a unique programmatic focus?

A: We are still working on which programs should be specific to Fontana. While we are grateful for Interim Dean Chevalier, we will eventually hire a permanent dean for the Fontana campus.

Q: Will faculty have the opportunity to provide input for the new fontana campus?

A: Yes! We will be seeking input from faculty and staff. The master plan is still in an embryonic stage.

Q: What are your thoughts and possible projections about returning to face-to-face instruction in the near future?

A: While I don't see Chaffey being fully online, I do see our face-to-face instruction being enhanced with technology upon our return to campus. Some of our student populations need face-to-face instruction. Specifically, the transition to online instruction is especially difficult for our first-generation students. We will be primarily online for Spring and Summer 2021. We will make a decision on Fall 2021 in late December or early January.

Q: What is the thought process for transitioning back to face-to-face instruction?



A: Our motto is "Slow, safe and sustainable". We are looking at Covid-19 numbers in San Bernardino county. Until the numbers begin going down, we will be required to follow the state and county guidelines for social distancing and continue to teach most of our classes in an online environment.

Q: What does our budget look like and what implications does it have?

A: We have a decent reserve that will carry us for about 5-6 months. We have asked our current deans to pick up more responsibility to allow us to save funds on hiring new deans. We were recognized as being one of the top Hispanic serving institutions across the country. The Jay Pritzker Foundation has issued a \$100 million grant to California community colleges and Chaffey College is one of 34 colleges chosen to receive funds.

Q: Is it possible to have lower caps for face-to-face classes when returning to campus to allow for social distancing or will that negatively impact the budget?

A: Lowering the caps will negatively affect the budget. If we offer a combination of students learning from home and learning face-to-face, we still need to reasonably meet the caps to make sure the budget is adequate. The solution is not to lower the cap but to expand ways to increase the amount of students to meet the cap. The College will do its best to offer online and face-to-face classes to the FON and the 50% law so as to not get penalized. Lowering the cap will not be an option.

Q: Will we still be asked to go through the prioritization process?

A: Although it looks like hiring full-time faculty will be minimal, we will still go through the prioritization process so that we're prepared.

• Dr. Shannon asked how might faculty want to stay engaged with all of these projects that are currently underway. He inquired as to how to keep faculty in the loop.

Senate responded that faculty can stay in the loop by receiving consistent information through important committees like the Measure P Workgroup, President's Cabinet, and others. It would also be great to receive regular communication about our current standing with student success metrics that may help guide our conversations in Senate.

Vice President Rosas shared that the college website is a work in progress. Her team will send out campus communication when updates are being made to the website. We are currently focusing on two areas as it pertains to the program pages.
