7.6 Committees

- **8. GUEST(S)/PRESENTATION(S)** Coordinator, Distance Education, Angela Cardinale will provide a DE update and discuss Hyflex,
 - Hyflex Instruction Any aspect of a course that can be done "in-person" can also be done through distance learning. The modality of "Hyflex" can vary depending on the college's recommendations.
 - IR is going to assess student and faculty needs, forming classroom policies, technology needs, and models at other colleges.
 - There is a commitment to having a TA in the hyflex courses to help assist students.
 - Senator Holdiness asked about involvement in the Hyflex meetings, which are held on Tuesday mornings at 10 am.
 - Senator Encarnacion asked if faculty would be able to "opt-in" to teaching the hyflex modality or if
 faculty would be given the classes, alongside "Hyflex training" prior to teaching in this modality.
 Angela Cardinale and Laura Hope emphasized that the current process is a trial phase to see what
 aspects must be negotiated in future contracts and specific needs of departments. There would be
 training and recommendation aspects prior to executing this modality on a large scale.

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- Senator Cotton and Senator Collins asked if there would be curriculum approval for the additional modality, and certain elements within lab courses that might cause problems within the curriculum.
 Angela Cardinale stated that yes and that departments would need to take ownership to build further recommendations.
- President Watkins asked questions regarding the technicalities in terms of the video cameras that were recently added to classrooms and how students would choose the modalities they are interacting through.
- Senator Cotton asked about the camera and microphone needs for courses that use a lot of movement around the room. Angela Cardinale stated that this was a consideration that the group was working through in the pilot program for spring 2022.

9. UNFINISHED BUSINESS

- **9.1 Action Item:** Sabbatical Leave Applications/Subcommittee: Readers are required to immediately contact the writer, coordinate discussion amongst themselves, and bring recommendations, concerns, etc. to Academic Senate NO LATER than Due by Tuesday, November 30. 10. NEW BUSINESS

- **10.1 Action Item:** Renewing online meeting format / <u>AB 361</u> till December 7 the last meeting of the semester
 - It is President Watkins' understanding that the Chaffey Academic Senate can vote to approve
 the continuation of teleconference meetings. This extends an emergency provision to
 continue until next year.
 - Motion for Approval Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick moved that Academic Senate and all standing subcommittees to continue teleconference meetings for the next 30 days in accordance to AB 361. Senator Holdiness seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 11.9.21, 23Y,0N,0A.
- **10.2** Action Item: Calendar of religious holidays and observances
 - President Watkins spoke with Laura Hope and recommended that the Calendar Committee work in collaboration with the Equity Council.
 - This calendar would . . . List the many holidays and religious observances that reflect the diversity of our campus community. Foster a greater sense of belonging for students and employees from diverse religious and cultural backgrounds. Encourage faculty to make allowances or adjustments as needed if students miss a class or need an extension because of a holiday. Allow faculty to plan field trips or other significant activities so that they do

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not coincide with these holidays. And increase awareness among colleagues of each other's holidays and observances.

- **Motion for Approval** Senator Encarnacion motioned to form a workgroup to explore options and opportunities regarding the creation and execution of a culturally and religiously inclusive calendar separate from the academic calendar. Senator Kern seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 11.9.21, 22Y/0N/0A.
 - Senator Obsurn recommended not using the word "holiday" which has a specific definition as per the contract.
 - Senator Cotton expressed that the use of the word "holiday" is important in terms of understanding the cultural and religious impact on the individuals that celebrate them.
 - Senator Kern asked a question in regards to what cultural or religious holidays will be put on the calendar and what will happen if students come forward stating that their religious or cultural observances are not listed on said calendar.
 - Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick emphasized that the work of all committees should include elements of DEI advancement, and therefore the calendar committee might need to expand their purview under the advice of PEC.
 - Senator Hijaz emphasized the importance of showcasing these cultural and religious holidays as equal and not separate to other calendar holidays.
 - Senator Osburn stated that Article 17 in the contract references the purview of the calendar committee to consider in developing the DEI calendar.

11.1.1 2021 Mentorship Handbook: ASCCC recognizes that mentorship is a key component to the success of new faculty, both for those employed full-time or part-time, as well as for those seeking employment opportunities in the California community colleges. In response to two resolutions from Spring 2016: Resolution Number 01.01 and Fall 2020: Resolution Number 01.02, this handbook was developed by the ASCCC Part-time Committee in 2021 to provide a

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written guide and repository of resources for the development of mentorship programs at California community colleges. While this handbook was initially developed in response to the aforementioned resolutions to provide mentor resources for part-time faculty, it became clear that these materials and practices could be used more broadly for all faculty seeking equity-minded professional growth and empowerment. The intent of this handbook is to provide tools and model practices for all faculty and local and district leaders in the creation of mentor programs as well as support to mentor and mentees in community college mentorship programs.
