Strategies to Increase Success & Retention

Retaining students in classes should be a top priority so that they continue in the subsequent semester. Your enthusiasm, clear instruction, quick replies to messages, and consistent support can all increase student engagement whether you are teaching online or in person.

Please consider implementing these ideas in your current courses:

- Email students before the first class to welcome them to your course.
- Reach out to students who registered but did not attend on the first day; encourage them to attend and continue in the course.
- Learn your students' names and some information about who they are as soon as possible.
- Check in with students who miss class, assignments, or exams; encourage them to attend, participate, and continue in the course.
- Incorporate instructional support resources into your course. Research shows that students who use the <u>Library</u> and <u>Success Centers</u> have higher success and retention rates.
- Work with the Library to incorporate library research and use of librarian instruction into your course, or embed a librarian in your Canvas shell.
- Incorporate Directed Learning Activities into your courses; encourage or require attendance at a Success Center workshop. Direct students to <u>Supplemental Instruction</u>, PALs, etc.
- Connect your course content to students' career goals by integrating <u>ACES-ILO</u> employability skills assessment and badging into your classes.
- Tell students, "Before you think about dropping a course, please speak to me. I am here to help you." Let them know that you are there to support them or work with them if they have any challenges.
- Modify how you talk to students: "you matter" / "you belong here" / "thank you for being here."
- Share your pronouns in Zoom, Canvas, email signatures, and syllabi to foster an inclusive educational environment for the LGBTQIA+ community on campus.
- Encourage students to register for fast-track 2 courses and the next semester.
- Remind students about the deadlines for <u>UC</u> / <u>CSU</u> apps in the fall semester (Nov. 30); remind them about the <u>FAFSA</u> / <u>CA Dream Act</u> deadlines in the spring semester (March 2).

Please consider these ideas for future semesters:

- Examine the success and retention rates within your department; develop discipline-specific strategies to increase those rates.
- Use zero-cost textbooks. Research shows that students in <u>ZTC</u> sections have higher success and retention rates.
- Complete the <u>POCR</u> training and align your courses (alignment is for fully-online courses only). Research shows that students in POCR-aligned courses have higher success and retention rates.
- Volunteer to teach dual enrollment sections or at Turning Point (CIM & CIW).
- Explore equity-based grading and competency-based learning / instruction.

The MOU between the CCFA and district for 2022-2023 includes the following provisions:

"Within the first week of instruction, faculty will reach out to students who are absent or have not logged in on the first day of class meetings and urge them to attend/log-in and participate in class."

"Faculty will include a statement in their syllabi encouraging students to speak to the instructor before dropping a class."

"Faculty agree to publish, no later than the first day of instruction based on the academic calendar, and maintain a course shell in the District learning management system for all assigned classes that includes an electronic copy of the syllabus, an up-to-date gradebook, and information about how office hours (if applicable) will be conducted and times of availability. For this purpose, District-sponsored certification for Distance Education instruction is not required for face-to-face classes (non-distance education), though it is recommended."
