- AIG Meeting
 - 1. When DPS provides faculty with accommodations for the student, the instructor can not deny those accommodations. This is not an option, faculty must comply.
 - 2. The student must have an initial conversation with their faculty about their accommodations.
 - 3. President Watkins asked Senators to share this information at the department meetings.
- Can adjunct faculty use College Wrap?
 - 1. No, the adjunct can not use College Wrap
 - 2. The issue of adjuncts healthcare is on the District interest list for negotiations.

 - 1. When a class fills the class closes and a waitlist is formed. If a student should drop before the first day of the semester, the system will automatically ask the first student on the waitlist if they want to add. There is a time limit to add. Once the class starts only a faculty could add the student.
 - 2. The online pdf class list will be sorted first by course and then the lowest enrolled courses will be on top. This will drive students to lower enrolled classes.






What we have Achieved

Between 2017 and 2022, Black women consistently experienced disproportionate impact on four out of the five metrics.

- Black women saw a slight improvement with 22.7% successfully enrolling in the first year during the 2017-18.
- For attaining the Vision for Success definition of completion within three-years, Black women went from 5.9% in 2017-18 to 6.5% in 2018-19 (a 0.6% improvement).






Racial Equity Commitments
