 Dr. Romo recommended a way to report anonymously if there were students who felt they were being denied religious freedoms. Discussions surrounded anonymous versus confidential reporting of both students and faculty/staff from Guest Angela Ybarra, Senator Jeff Harlow, and Senator Encarnacion. Senator Holdiness asked what body or position would be responsible for updating this calendar, which was yet to be determined.

10. NEW BUSINESS

10.1 Discussion Item: Faculty Workgroup Regarding the Portal

 Discussion: Focused on changing internal college communication and what clubs/committees/organizations on campus an individual wants to follow and be kept up to date on. Faculty voices to help design the faculty portal is an important element. Eric Houck, Executive Direction, Information Technology spoke to the importance of collaboration. President Watkins stated that the Academic Senate would send out an open call for faculty.

10.2 Discussion Item: Fall 2022 Scheduling

- **Discussion:** Academic Senate is not under the purview of the 10+2 but there are aspects within instruction that are impacted by scheduling. There has been discussion in regards to 70% of classes will remain online in the Fall 2022 and less than 35% of classes will be 18-week courses.
- Senator Chamberlain stated that there are questions regarding the data used in collecting the
 information in making decisions regarding scheduling. Senator Chamberlain also asked for
 transparency in regards to the "College/Campus goals" being interpreted across disciplines that
 require different needs.
- Senator Fisher expressed that they believe the pandemic has fundamentally shifted student demands and the way they consume education (in terms of in-person and online learning). Guest Sandra Collins echoed these sentiments and explained that within the Biology department things are different in terms of pedagogy and discipline needs.
- Senator Osburn stated that in a recent Labor Management meeting, exceptions to in-person
 instruction were granted given enrollment perils. College-wide goals of 35% in-person instruction
 is "conservative" in terms of other campuses trying to force back to in-person instruction. Senator
 Osburn stated that they will be falling back to the language in the contract.
- Senator Gutierrez stated that in the Math Department, there were questions in regards to the data and reasoning between structures of 18/14/8 week courses in regards to how they will best serve students.

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 Senator Encarnacion stated that feedback they received from students spoke directly to the changes that occurred at the top of the semester reverting in-person instruction to online



instruction. Many students stated through email correspondence that they were dropping the course because they were not comfortable or confident taking the course in an online-only format. Senator Encarnacion stated that it will be important for students' security and confidence in registering for courses for those courses to remain in the modalities that they are assigned and having the campus working diligently to maintain those modalities from start to finish.

- Senator Witt stated that a 14-week course and a 8 week course will finish in the same week which
 will impact student final exams. Senator Witt also emphasized the restrictions regarding
 asynchronous and synchronous instruction and "confusion" regarding these learning modalities.
 Senator Witt stated that allowing instructors the opportunity to choose modality would be
 important for disciplined faculty to decide what is best for their pedagogical needs.
- Senator Peoples expressed concern regarding courses being dropped and late registration and
 those dates not matching up. Senator Peoples gave an example of a course that is dropped and
 student perceptions being that they still have two weeks into the semester to register, which may
 increase those enrollment numbers so the course is not canceled.
- Curriculum Chair Burk-Herrick explained that building courses one year in advance is for student
 planning tools that in turn help administration prepare for future enrollment predictions. Students
 need courses built in order to drop classes into their "student planning" tools, they cannot do so if
 there are no courses built. Senator Osburn stated that this also helps configuring load for faculty.
- Senator Shelton suggested that 14-week courses that start at the beginning of the term should "dip in" to the 18-week and fast track 1 courses that have the same start so we are not impacting the various entry points that students have currently to enroll in classes.
- Senator Peoples expressed that Adjunct Faculty will find challenges in planning out one year ahead being unable to plan that far ahead.
