Department / Program Accomplishments

The Chaffey College Math Department is partnering with Cal Poly Pomona to improve success rates in Math for Elementary School Teachers courses.

The Math Department is embarking on a new 2-year grant with Cal Poly Pomona. The grant is titled “Community College Mathematics Partnership for University Teacher Education” and its goals are (1) articulate Math-4 “Math for Elementary School Teachers” to their MAT-1940 “Mathematical Concepts for Elementary School Teachers” (2) redesign how the curriculum is presented to make it more effective, relevant, and meaningful to teachers who are faced with the challenging task of rich mathematics instruction for their students.

This grant is funded by the National Science Foundation and will provide math faculty professional development on active learning and teaching strategies as well as establish a community of practice throughout the 2 years.

Articulating Math 4 with Cal Poly Pomona may extend articulation of Chaffey’s Math 4 to other universities like Cal State LA, San Diego State, and CSU Long Beach.

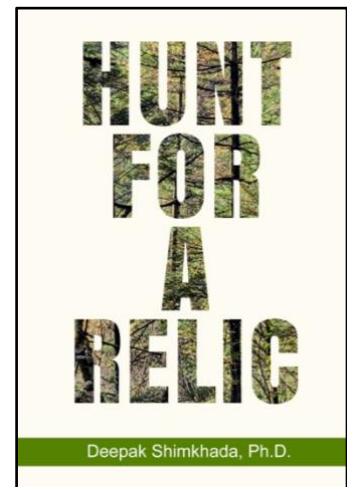


Deepak Shimkhada (Art)

Rising Scholar Document

Chaffey College's Turning Point program has served part of this population for over 15 years. Most recently the on-campus component and program has begun serving formerly incarcerated students formally. These efforts began in May 2021. Currently Chaffey is serving 169 Turning Point students between the two prisons with one facilitator on 50 % reassignment and a part-time facilitator overseeing the Rising Scholars (on-campus) program serving over 50 students. As we return to campus and in-person instruction in both CIM and CIW the demand for access to education and the support needed on campus will likely exponentially increase. These facilitators have provided training, faculty support, student support and coordination of services across campus departments and community partners.

We are one of two colleges in Region 9 with an on-campus program. The other is San Bernardino Valley College. We are also one of two colleges in Region 9 with a prison program, Norco College is serving CRC. For our region, we are the only college simultaneously serving both incarcerated and formerly incarcerated students. Across the state 62 colleges have campus programs whereas 22 colleges have prison programs.

In seeking out the funding for the grant we hope the college would consider a more stable infrastructure for the programs. Some of the recommendations below are directed from the guiding principles for both on-campus and prison programs.

Program Recommendation

- **Program Director or Coordinator having experience with system impacted students**
- Administrative support
- A full-time position
- Programs often include a program director, and affiliated faculty
- Navigate important relationships with campus departments and external partners.
- **At least one staff member should be formally incarcerated**
- Personal experience with the criminal justice system
- Experience builds important rapport between the program and students.
- The director or coordinator should be able to devote sufficient time to ensure student and programmatic success and serve as the voice mitigating potential concerns of college personnel about formerly incarcerated students. .

Instructional rationale for paid office hours for all adjuncts - notes from Senate Fall 2021 meeting

- Application process seems unwieldy / unfair
- Contract says one section even though one nursing section is many FTEF
- Mt. SAC & SBVC have such a stipend
- Some adjuncts want the current office hours but aren't able to get them
- Equitable delivery of instruction
- "Office hours are for everyone"
- Paid adjunct hours leads to more investment from instructors
- Students want more access as reported in success centers
- Student POV:
 - FT faculty easy to find
 - PT faculty without offices are hard to find
 - Hard to get clarification about assignments
 - One per week would be enough
 - Zoom hours would be ok even if class is FTF

The [ASCCC Local Senates Handbook](#) mentions the ways in a which a local Senate works with the local union on such matters:

Education Code: § 87610.1(a) Tenure Evaluation Procedures

Requires that collective bargaining agents, or faculty collective bargaining units, consult with the academic senate prior to negotiating tenure evaluation procedures.

Education Code: § 87663 (f) Evaluation Procedures

Requires that collective bargaining agents, or faculty collective bargaining units, consult with the academic senate prior to negotiating faculty evaluation procedures.

Education Code: § 87743.2 Faculty Service Areas

Requires that collective bargaining agents, or faculty collective bargaining units, consult with the academic senate prior to negotiating Faculty Service Areas (FSA).

Scheduling Principles for Fall 2022 and Spring 2023

1. Chaffey will strive for an initial ratio of 65% online offerings and 35% in-person offerings.

Rationale: We are incrementally moving toward an environment in which we want to re-engage the 20% of learners we have lost during the period we have primarily been online. This ratio represents an incremental increase from our current rate of 28% of in-person learning this semester. This goal is an overall institutional goal, not an individual department or program goal. Subsequent offerings will follow student demand.

2. Chaffey's deans and coordinators will endeavor to plan both fall 2022 and spring 2023 this spring.

Rationale: Fall 2022 registration occurs toward the end of spring 2022, and that schedule will be built in full in accordance with traditional timelines. Spring will be designed and planned as a framework and include the specifics in the College's information system sooner than usual in order to advance student planning and counseling efforts.

3. Chaffey's schedule will reflect a variety of term length choices.

Rationale: In a series of surveys and in enrollment behavior, students increasingly indicate that they desire a variety of modality options and term length opportunities. As a result, the College will decrease the ratio of full-term courses from its current rate of 39% to 35% next year. The schedule will also include a new 14-week term that will begin at the beginning of the full-term but will end in November. This semester, College stakeholders will discuss the "rebranding" and communication of the multiple term lengths to make them clearer to students and support their learning choices.

4. The College has affirmed with CCFA that the Collective Bargaining Agreement ratios of online and in-person instruction for full-time faculty will guide scheduling.

Rationale: Those parameters are articulated in 19.1 of the Contract between CCFA and the District and sufficiently allows for options for a variety of modalities to support full-time faculty schedules and student demand. The provision reads as follows:

19.1 A maximum of total of load and overload of twelve equated hours or 40 FTEF for each term may be taught via distance education. For hybrid classes only the online portion will be applied to the maximum load limits. In special circumstances and by mutual consent, expectations may be granted by the appropriate executive administrator.
