10.1 Discussion Item: Collaboration with Umoja on Gabrieleno-Tongva Land Blessing

 Motion for Approval - Senator Holdiness moved to endorse the collaboration with Umoja on Gabrieleno-Tongva Land Blessing. Senator Chamberlain seconded the motion. The motion was approved. 3.22.22, 20Y/0N/0A.

10.2 Discussion Item: Proper Usage of Students' Names and Pronouns

- President Watkins reminded faculty to encourage asking students the name they would like to be called
 in class, that might differ from the name provided on the course roster or on Canvas, in addition to
 asking for and using students pronouns to properly address them. Instructors can guide students towards
 the Student Name Change form if they would like to update the name used for these informal locations
 - Student Name Change Form:

- Senator Encarnacion stated that in addition to asking and promoting the use of students' individual
 pronouns, to self-monitor the use of unnecessary gendered pronouns within classroom experiences such
 as examples or discussions. Senator Johnson emphasized this point by giving the example of working to
 saying "Hey guys" when speaking to a large group of people. Curriculum Burk-Herrick stated that the

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intentionality of utilizing students' pronouns appropriately is an action of intent versus impact, and while we may not understand the severity of misgendering someone, the impact is more important. Senator Chamberlain echoed these sentiments.

 courses across Chaffey campus.

Whereas communities of color (such as those in the Chaffey College service area) are <u>disproportionately affected</u> by climate change, pollution, and other environmental issues,

Whereas we are preparing students to be <u>ethical global citizens</u> and good stewards of the environment,
