- 1. Call To Order/New Committee Members: The meeting was called to 1:40p.m. The Curriculum Chair introduced Erik Sanchez, the new student representative for the Curriculum Committee.
- 2. Review and Approval of October 12, 2016 Expanded Summary Notes: The summary notes were approved 17/0/0.

### 3. Discussion Items:

- **3.1. Curriculum Website:** The Chair presented the new Curriculum website (<u>http://www.chaffey.edu/curriculum/</u>)that was created by the Administrative Assistant for Curriculum and the Graphics Department.
- **3.2. Technical Review Four Week Process:** The Chair shared that the Technical Review Process will now have a four-week review deadline to expedite the local approval process. All proposals will be moved forward the day after the deadline.
- **3.3. Curriculum Office Review of Two and Six-Year Updates:** The Curriculum Office will now be responsible for sending departmental reminders for courses and programs to be reviewed: CTE courses and programs every two years and non-CTE courses and programs every six years.
- **3.4. CPC Curriculum Planning Report:** The Chair shared a handout on the latest information on C-IDs. Many CTE courses are now going through C-ID approvals to ensure there are course agreements between Community Colleges. There are new C-IDs for Real Estate and she encouraged the Business and Applied Technology Curriculum Representatives to share this with their team. The Articulation Officer (AO) shared that there will be an workgroup for a Digital Media CTE degree on November 18 and encouraged Art Faculty to receive more information on <a href="https://c-id.net/">https://c-id.net/</a>.

- **3.5. Distance Education Continued:** The Chair presented the new draft for DE Addendum modeled from Shasta College which incorporates questions on regular effective practices for student and instructor contact. The Chair asked all faculty who currently have a DE proposal in Curricunet to complete the draft, upload it to their current proposal in the rationale section, and provide feedback on the addenda. If the feedback is positive, the Chair will send the addenda to Curricunet to serve as the new DE addendum for all future DE proposals.
- 4. University Studies: The Chair shared the history of the University Studies degrees and how there is a mandatory need for revision to these degrees' due to their incompliance with Title 5 regulations. New replacement drafts have been made that are in compliance with the law in that the courses in the new draft all relate to the first two digits of the same TOP Code. Counselor, Cherlou Opulencia, expanded on the history and shared how the ADTs are the optimal options for students who plan to transfer, but the University Studies degrees remain an option for all students as many students use these degrees for several reasons such as transferring to a private university. The new degrees have been designed with the cooperation of the Counselors and the Chair due to the past decision that the Curriculum Committee would be responsible for these degrees. The Chair reiterated the importance of honoring the decision made by the committee to deactivate the current University Studies degrees due to their evident incompliances. The Chair shared that she spoke heavily with certain deans and faculty about the revision and designs of these new drafts. The Committee is responsible for reviewing, discussing, and approving the drafts. These degrees are now in the review period. This means counselors and discipline faculty are to review these degrees together before the degrees are formally discussed in a meeting and even considered for approval. Guest and Faculty member, Misty Burruel, shared her concerns that the degrees should have been developed and launched under appropriate discipline faculty. Angela Burk-Herrick shared a similar concern that she had discussed a Math and Science Degree that follows the University Studies model with faculty from the School of Math and Science, all of whom felt such a degree would not be appropriate, yet a degree was made without the input of any math or science discipline faculty. Faculty Senate President, Ardon Alger, defined these degrees to be about breadth and not depth. Angela also mentioned that the titles of these degrees are misleading to students and future employers about the depth of the knowledge they are receiving. She challenged the true function of these degrees as they may misrepresent a specialty in these fields. Counselor, Lucy Serrano, clarified that these degrees support the individual needs of students that may no longer have a goal of transfer, but want to have a completed degree for employment purposes. The Chair invited faculty to come together to craft a degree that serves the purpose of the Counselors and Disciplines without infringing on the ADTs. Tom Vitzelio reiterated his viewpoint that these degrees should have never been under the purview of the Curriculum Committee because there needs to be discipline faculty ownership of these degrees for many reasons, one being Program and Services Review (PSR). David Schlanger reiterated the University Studies discussion from last year as to why these degrees need to be deactivated. He quoted Title 5 language that defines an Associate Degree to have "sufficient depth", which is contrary to the aforementioned idea that degrees can be based on breadth instead of depth. The current University Studies degrees and new degree drafts support breadth and not depth as outlined as necessity for a degree in Title 5. After further discussion ensued, Dr. Randall shared Mt. San Antonio College's (Mt. SAC) degrees that are an AA in Liberal Arts and Sciences with different emphases. Angela shared she would be more comfortable with a similar degree being created for Chaffey students as the titles of Mt. SAC's degrees are not misleading and inform students that the degrees are centered around breadth only. David Schlanger shared another past discussion centered around Title 5 language that there are two types of Associate Degrees: Major-based or Area of Emphasis. He stated that Title 5 defines a major to be 18 or more units under one TOP Code. He also stated that Area of Emphasis is defined as "lower divisions coursework which prepare students for a field of a study or specific major at the UC or CSUs." Dr. Randall clarified that new PCAH now has three options for a degree: Transfer, Local (i.e. Interdisciplinary), or CTE and our new degrees must be centered around these three options. The discussion ended with the question of "Who is responsible for these degrees and the health of these programs in general?" Dr. Randall will confirm with Mt. SAC who is in ownership of their degrees and Program Review and share this with the committee at the next meeting.
