Flex FAQ'S Chart

This chart shows the usual Flex obligation. For this semester all faculty received 4-7 hours Flex credit per the recently signed, <u>MOU</u> due to COVID-19.

	Full-Time Faculty	Part-Time Faculty
Is flex required?	Yes	Yes, for faculty who would normally teach classes on the same day(s) of the week as required flex day(s). Consult with your dean or coordinator for more info.
How many flex hours are required per day?	4-7 hours per day	Hours equal to the number of teaching hours that would otherwise occur on that day of the week.
Is flex required if I teach online?	Yes, 4-7 hours per day	No, flex hours are not required for online classes.
Outside of flex days, can other professional development count towards my flex requirement?	2 of 5 flex days may be in-lieu of flex with prior approval from your dean. Consult your dean for the <u>form</u> and deadline.	Uncompensated professional development counts for flex
On flex days, can I engage in professional development activities other than scheduled flex workshops?	Yes, refer to <u>activity codes</u>	credit if pre-approved by your dean.
