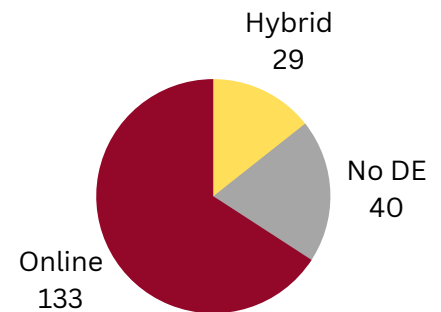
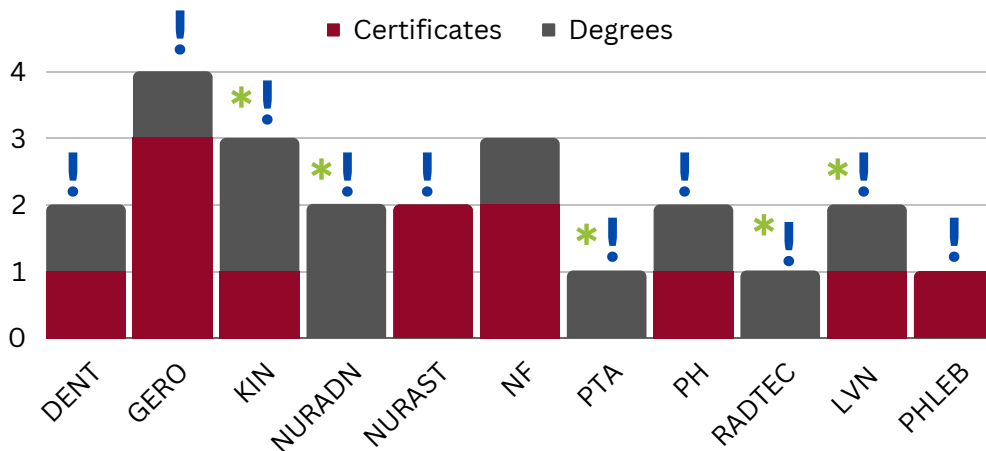


NUMBER OF AWARD EARNERS

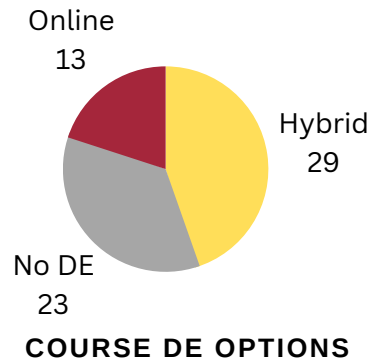
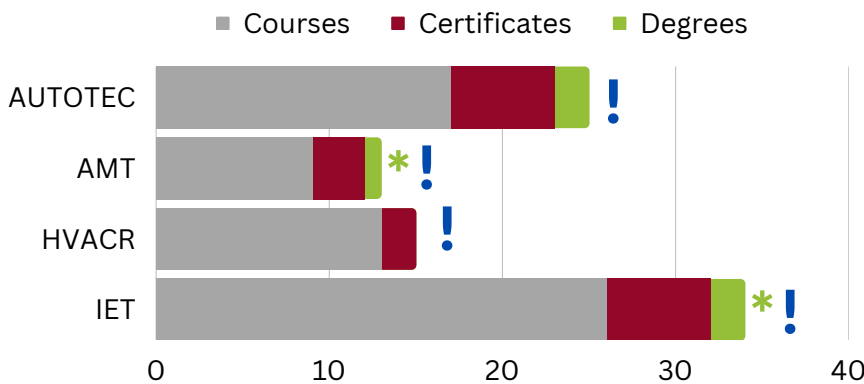


NUMBER OF AWARD EARNERS
