

Women's Basketball

2/13 – The women traveled to Antelope Valley to take on the Marauders. Going into Wednesday's game, both teams were tied for third place in the Foothill Conference behind Mt San Jacinto and San Bernardino. Tamesha Jackson led the Panthers with 17 points. Antelope Valley answered with Boise State recruit 6'8 Robert Arnold hitting a runner to send the game into overtime. Jeff Sawyerr (AB Miller) was 4 / 4 from the charity strip in overtime and Isaac Segovia (AB Miller) made a huge three point basket in OT to put the "CHP" up 69 – 66 in the extra period. Leading the CHP were Jordan Block, Jeffrey Sawyerr and Brandon Clemons. The team plays Saturday at Rio Hondo. The Roadrunners have won three straight games in conference.

Baseball

2/8 – It was tough loss for Panther baseball last Friday as they took on Central Arizona College, one of the top ranked JC teams in the nation -- final score 12-4. At the end of the second, the Panthers trailed by 1, but in the third Arizona scored 7 runs off 7 hits taking the score to 8-0 where it stayed until the 5th inning with AZ scoring again. In the bottom of the 5th, Mychal Johnson scored on a hit by David Gwin bouncing the score to 9-1. Arizona bounced back in the 6th to score 2 more runs. Followed by a Panther attack in the 7th with Mychal Johnson crossing the plate on a double by James Koerner. Greg Allen hit an over the leftfield fence homerun bringing in Koerner on an RBI, score 11-4. In the 8th, AZ scored their final run of the game -- final score 12-4. Sunday, the team took on Cypress (game rained out from January) and lost 4-13.

Grossmont fought back in the 5th with 2 runs, Chaffey in the 6th with Escalera crossing the plate on a balk.
