

ABOUT THE COLLEGE

The College

Chaffey College, one of the first colleges to be established in California, is a two-year public community college situated in an area of natural and tranquil beauty in Southern California. The campus occupies 200 acres of rolling lawns and native foliage in the foothills of the majestic San Gabriel Mountains. Founded in 1883 as a private college, Chaffey has been a publicly funded college since 1916.

Curricula

Chaffey College offers two year associate in art or science degrees in academic or vocational fields, one-year certificates of achievement, and transfer programs that meet the lower-division requirements for a baccalaureate degree to be obtained at a four-year college or university. The college operates on the semester system, which consists of fall, spring, and summer terms.

Chaffey courses are offered at the main campus in Rancho Cucamonga and off-campus centers in Chino, Fontana, and the new Chino Information Technology Center.

District

The college district serves a population of 600,000 in the west end of the vibrant Inland Empire of San Bernardino County, including the communities of Chino, Chino Hills, Fontana, Montclair, Ontario, Rancho Cucamonga, and Upland.

The Program

WHAT IS EOPS?

EOPS (Extended Opportunity Programs & Services) is a state funded program that offers support services to economically disadvantaged students who have experienced limited success in high school and/or college. We endeavor to ensure student retention and success through academic support and financial assistance with the ultimate goal being completion of a certificate program, an associate degree and/or transfer to a four-year university.

WHAT SERVICES DOES EOPS OFFER?

- **Counseling** – our counseling team offers academic and limited personal counseling
- **Priority Registration**
- **Orientation** to college classes
- **Cultural Awareness Activities**
- **Book Service** to assist in purchasing textbooks for classes
- **Transportation Assistance**

Please Note: Not all services are available every semester.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

You may be eligible for the EOPS program if you:

- Qualify for a BOGG (fee waiver) type A or B as determined by the Financial Aid Office

And meet one of the following criteria:

- Have not earned a high school diploma nor the equivalent or graduated from high school with less than 2.5 (C+) grade point average
- Have Chaffey College assessment test results which indicate that you do not qualify to enroll into degree applicable English or Mathematics courses.
- Have completed 500 series English or Math at Chaffey College or the equivalent at another college
- Have completed remedial course work or English as a Second Language classes in high school and/or college.

HOW LONG CAN STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN THE EOPS PROGRAM?

As long as you maintain good standing with EOPS and there is not a break in participation, your benefits will continue until completion of:

- 70 degree applicable semester units or the equivalent, including courses from all colleges attended

OR

- 6 semesters in the EOPS program, (excluding summer sessions)



WHAT ARE YOUR RESPONSIBILITIES?

- Must be a full-time student. (Enrolled in and maintaining 12 units each semester)
- Select classes from the educational plan developed with an EOPS counselor.
- Enroll in and complete Guidance 2 or 503, Orientation to College, as advised by an EOPS counselor.
- Participate in a start-term, mid-term, and end-term interview each semester.
- Meet with an EOPS counselor before dropping a class or making schedule changes.
- Maintain satisfactory academic progress.

WHAT IS CARE?

CARE (Cooperative Agencies Resources for Education) is a program that serves a limited number of EOPS students who are single head of household parents. It provides additional support and services beyond those which are available through EOPS.

WHAT SERVICES DOES CARE OFFER?

CARE students can select benefits that best suit their needs. Available services may include:

- Workshops & Seminars
- Additional Book Service
- Transportation Assistance
- Cafeteria Food Vouchers
- Child Care Assistance

Please Note: Not all services are available every semester.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

You may be eligible for CARE if you:

- Are an EOPS student
- Are a single head of household
- Are a CalWORKS recipient
- Have a child under 14 years of age

Space in the CARE Program is extremely limited and may not be sufficient to serve all eligible EOPS students.
