

DO YOU THINK YOU HAVE A LEARNING DISABILITY?
NEVER BEEN TESTED?
HERE'S WHAT TO DO . . .

If you feel you might have a learning disability but have never been tested for one, we can test you to see if you meet the profile of an LD student as defined by the California Community College system.

If you are interested, you can fill out the [Do You Feel You Have a Disability?](#) form and return it to our office. We will contact you to set up an appointment to begin the process.

You could also come by the DPS office (CCW 21) or call (941-2379) and tell us that you are interested in being tested.

Steps in being tested for a learning disability at Chaffey College:

- Enroll in DPS 505, the class through which the testing will occur.
- Once you have enrolled in the class the DPS receptionist will schedule your appointment.
- This first appointment lasts three hours and includes:
 - a. an intake interview
 - b. reading tests
 - c. math tests
 - d. English tests
- Once you complete the first appointment the receptionist will schedule your second appointment.
- During the second appointment, which also lasts three hours, you will be given an aptitude or IQ test and the results of all the testing from both appointments will be discussed with you.

At this second appointment the resource specialist will tell you whether or not you qualify for the LD program, and, if you do, what accommodations we can offer to assist you with classes at Chaffey.

If you do not qualify for the LD program, we will try to give you suggestions for ways you can help yourself improve your performance in class.
