1. From the library homepage at [www.chaffey.edu/library](http://www.chaffey.edu/library), click on the link labeled **AGent**.

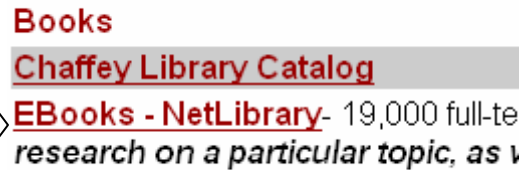

2. In the login box, type in your seven-digit Chaffey ID number in the first box, and your birth date in the second box using the following format: two numbers for the month, two of the day, and the last two numbers of the year, no spaces or dashes in between the numbers.

Then click on the **My Account Login** button.

3. Click on the **Books** link in the gray area in the top of the page. **EBooks-NetLibrary** is the second link in this section. Click to open the database.

5. To access the full-text of an ebook, click on **View this eBook**.


**Note:** Access to these eBooks is limited to one computer user at a time, so you may occasionally get a message stating:

6. The **Table of Contents** for the book will come up on the left-hand side of the screen. To access a particular chapter, click on the chapter title to go to the first pages of that chapter.

7. A **Search this eContent** box is located below the Table of Contents. You can use this to see if there are occurrences of words or phrases in an ebook. The results will show up in the Table of Contents area of the screen.

8. There are navigation buttons in the upper right-hand corner of the screen labeled **Next** and **Previous** to move between pages. Pages can be printed or saved a page at a time. Unfortunately, this database does not have an email option.
