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5.2 STUDENT SERVICES PROGRAMS

5.2.1 Athletics [Education Code Section 78223]

- A. The superintendent/president shall ensure that the athletics program complies with the California Community Colleges Commission on Athletics Constitution and Sports Guides, and appropriate Conference Constitution regarding student athlete participation.
- B. The district shall maintain an organized program for men and women in intercollegiate athletics. The program shall not discriminate on the basis of gender in the availability of athletic opportunities.

5.2.2 Counseling [Education Code Section 72620; Title 5 Section 51018]

- A. The superintendent/president shall assure the provision of counseling service, including academic, career, and personal counseling that is related to the student's education.
- B. Counseling shall be required for all first time students enrolled for more than six units, students enrolled provisionally, and students on academic or progress probation.

5.2.3 Disabled Students Programs and Services [Educational Code Sections 67310, 84850; Title 5, Sections 56000 et seq.]

- A. The superintendent/president shall assure that the Disabled Students Programs and Services (DSPS) program conforms to all requirements established by the relevant law and regulations.
- B. The DSPS program shall be the primary provider for support programs and services that facilitate equal educational opportunities for students with disabilities who can profit from instruction as required by federal and state laws.



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- C. Students with disabilities shall be assisted to participate whenever possible in the regular educational programs in the district.
- D. No student with disabilities is required to participate in the DSPS program.
- E. DSPS services shall be available to students with verified disabilities. The services to be provided include, but are not limited to, reasonable accommodations, academic adjustments, accessible facilities, equipment, instructional programs, rehabilitation counseling and academic counseling.

5.2.4 Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) [Educational Code 69640-69656; Title 5 Sections 56200 et seq.]

- A. The superintendent/president shall assure that the Extended Opportunity Programs and Services (EOPS) program conforms to all requirements established by the relevant law and regulations.
- B. The EOPS program is established to provide services that may include, but are not limited to, outreach, recruitment, orientation, assessment, tutorial services, counseling and advising, and financial aid.
- C. Support services and programs that are in addition to the traditional student services programs shall be provided in order to assist students who have language, social, and economic disadvantages to succeed academically in the district.

5.2.5 Financial Aid [20 U.S.C. Sections 1070 et seq.; 34 CFR Section 668; Education Code Section 76300]

- A. The superintendent/president shall establish, publicize, and apply satisfactory academic progress standards for participants in Title IV student aid programs.
- B. A program of financial aid to students shall be provided, which may include, but is not limited to, scholarships, grants, loans, and work and employment programs.



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- C. All financial programs will adhere to guidelines, procedures and standards issued by the funding agency, and will incorporate federal, state and other applicable regulatory requirements.

5.2.6 Matriculation [Education Code Section 78210 et seq.; Title 5, Section 55500, 55530(a)(d)]

- A. The district shall provide matriculation services to students for the purpose of furthering equality of educational opportunity and academic success. The purpose of matriculation is to bring the student and the district into agreement regarding the student's educational goal through the district's established programs, policies and requirements.
- B. The superintendent/president shall establish procedures to assure implementation of matriculation services that comply with the Title 5 regulations.

5.2.7 Student Equity [Education Code Sections 66030, 66250 et seq.; 72010 et seq.; Title 5, Sections 51025 and 54220]

The superintendent/president assures student equity in educational programs and college services. The superintendent/president shall establish and implement a student equity plan that meets the Title 5 standards for such a plan.

5.2.8 Student Health Services [Education Code Section 76401]

Student health services shall be provided in order to contribute to the education aims of students by promoting physical and emotional well-being through health-oriented programs and services.

- A. Student Accident Insurance [Education Code Section 72506]

The superintendent/president shall assure that students are covered by accident insurance in those instances required by law or contract.



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B. Communicable Disease [Education Code Section 76403]

The superintendent/president shall establish procedures necessary to assure cooperation with local public health officials in measures necessary for the prevention and control of communicable diseases in students.

5.2.9 Transfer Center [Title 5, Section 51027]

- A. The superintendent/president shall assure that the district incorporates as part of its mission the transfer of its students to baccalaureate level institutions. The district recognizes that students who have been historically underrepresented in transfer to baccalaureate level institutions are a special responsibility.
- B. The superintendent/president shall assure that a transfer center plan is implemented that identifies appropriate target student populations, is designed to increase the transfer applications of underrepresented students and complies with law and regulations.
