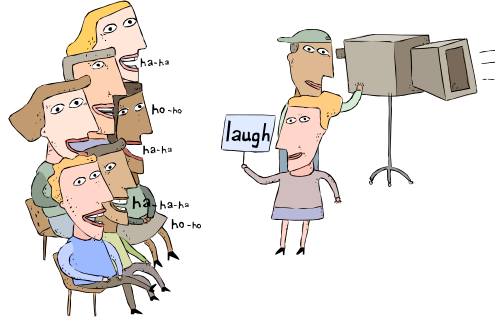


A Chaffey College Writing Center Workshop

What the writing is meant to accomplish (purpose), what angle will be used in the writing (tone), and who one is hoping to convince (audience) should all be carefully considered.

- Define and give examples of tone, emphasizing matter-of-fact tone
- Demonstrate the ways that tone, purpose, and audience work together
