Please use this worksheet in consultation with a Chaffey College Counselor. Requirements for admission to the LVN to RN Advanced Placement program include the successful completion of courses in biological sciences, along with general education courses, and satisfactory completion of NURADN 3 and 3L (Transition in Nursing). All requirements must be fulfilled prior to starting the program.

Preferred consideration for multicriteria screening and ranking will be given to student applicants who have satisfactorily completed ALL listed prerequisites and general education requirements with the minimum grade point average (GPA) requirements.

Please note: This worksheet does not replace the required ADN Multi Criteria evaluation conducted by the Transcript Evaluator Office at the time of application. All classes listed must be completed with a grade of "C" or better. Students must be in good standing (not on probation). Effective Fall 2014, all plus and minus grades MUST be used in the GPA calculation.

1. Students must have a current California Vocational License.

2. Students must have satisfactorily completed or are in-progress with NURADN 3 and 3L (Transition in Nursing). Term completed: _____

3. Biological Sciences:

All biological science courses must be completed at the time of application. There is no recency or repeat policy on the biological science prerequisites for this pathway. Online labs are accepted. The combined minimum GPA (grade point average) for these courses must be 2.80.

Continuous Attendance/Catalog Rights

The general education requirements apply to students during the 2024-2025 school year. Students who enrolled at Chaffey prior to Fall 2024 and who have maintained continuous attendance (attendance in at least one semester or two quarters, excluding summer sessions, each calendar year — January 1 through December 31 — as indicated on a permanent record) at any accredited college, have the option of meeting the current general education requirements or those in effect at the time continuous attendance at Chaffey began. Notes:

1. There is a non-degree option for this pathway, however, it is not recommended. Please contact the ADN Director and/or refer to the Chaffey College catalog for further information.
2. The CPR Card (American Heart Association Health Care Provider) must be current throughout the program, beginning in NURADN 35 (taken once per year).
3. The college does not provide transportation to clinical facilities. Students must provide their own transportation to clinical facilities.
4. In accordance with legislation and Education Code, admission criteria to the ADN Program will follow a multi-criteria screening and ranking, approved by the California Chancellors Office. Please visit the ADN Program website for more information.
5. To be eligible to take the state examination for licensure as a registered nurse, the California Board of Registered Nursing requires a high school diploma or equivalent and successful completion of an accredited nursing program. There are fees to obtain licensure by examination or endorsement, interim permit, and biennial renewal. Attend an ADN information session in the Fall or Spring semester for specific information. Refer to the ADN website for dates, times, and locations of these sessions.
6. Students with any convictions, including no contest pleas, infractions, misdemeanors, and felonies, should contact the Board of Registered Nursing regarding legal limitations for licensure. www.rn.ca.gov
7. A pre-enrollment assessment (TEAS) of basic math, reading, English, and science must be successfully completed in order to begin the program.
8. A criminal background check is done prior to entering NURADN 35.
9. A minimum grade of "C" is required in all courses.
10. Uniforms, physical exams, etc., will be discussed during the information sessions. Refer to the ADN website for dates, times, and locations.
11. Challenge/Advanced Placement into the nursing education program for U.S. Military Personnel is available. See the ADN website.

How to calculate your GPA:

- (1) Determine the grade points awarded for the grade you received.
- (2) Multiply the units of each course by the grade points awarded.
- (3) Divide the total number of grade points by the total number of units to calculate the GPA.
