## Chaffey ADN Prerequisite Overview

- Recency Policy: Physiology and Microbiology (lecture and lab)
   must be taken within the last 10 year, send of Summer 2012
   for Spring 2023 applications.
- Repeat Policy: Effective Fall 2019only one science course may be repeated within the last 5 years
- Online science labs will be accepted beginning Spring 2020 for courses that have been deemed equivalent to Chaffey's science courses. See a counselor for assistance.

- •A: No, the content in Math-40 1 is strictly for the Nursing program.



- Math-40 1 is a nursing program specific course that includes information on dosages, measurements, intravenous calculations and more.
- Math-40 1 is a one-unit course offered in a Fast-Track format and can be completed in Spring, Summer or Fall Terms.
- If you have completed a Math for Health Science course at another institution, please consult with a counselor for course equivalency.



Effective Fall 2022, NEW students beginning at Chaffey College in Fall 2022 or later are required to complete an Ethnic Studies course.

- 20% will be determined by random draw from the Phase 2 applicants.
- ❖ Typically, there are 35 40 seats available each term.
- On average, there are 300 applicants each term.
- The ADN Program does not have a waitlist.

## **ATI TEAS Version 7 Exam**

The ATI TEAS, or Test of Essential Academic Skills, is designed specifically to assess a student's preparedness elimented fields.

- ☐ The ATI TEAS Version 7 test is comprised of 170 questions set up in a multiple -choice format with four-option answers.
- Questions are designed to test the basic academic skills.
- Reading, Math, Science, and English and Language Usage.

## ATI TEAS Version 7 Exam

❖ When should I begin studying for the TEAS?
It is recommended to study for the TEAS at least 6 weeks in advance of taking the test. Most students begin while they are taking their Microbiology course

What if I already took the TEAS at another school? Chaffey College will use student's first passing score of 62% or higher withir one calendar year.



#### LVN-RN Advanced Placement



- Must complete ADN program prerequisites:
- 2.8 GPA biology science minimum
- 3.0 GPA "fixed" general education minimum
- Enroll and pass NURADN 3 & 3L
- No in-progress coursework is accepted
- Effective Fall 2022, there is no recency or repeat policy for Biology coursework.




- Additional CSUSB nursing prerequisite courses must be completed, i.e. Chemistry 9 (Health Science Chemistry) or Chem-10 (Intro to Chemistry)
- CSU Certification: General Education Certification means that Chaffey College has verified that a student has completed lower-division general education requirements for the CSU system.
- 2.75 baccalaureate total cumulative GPA.
- No in-progress course work accepted. Applications are accepted during the Spring semesters only
- Students will be selected using the ADN multicriteria screening worksheet based on points
- An Ethnic Studies course will be required as of FA 20 24

#### **Scheduling a Counseling Appointment**

Counseling appointments are scheduled in **ConexED**. If you are a Chaffey College student make sure that you select the Chaffey College Student Icon. If you are not a Chaffey College student, make sure you select the Guest Icon and create a guest account.

When making an appointment be sure to select the correct meeting location desired. For In-person locations there are three locations available: Rancho, Chino, and Fontana campus. Reference chart above for important information for each type of appointment you are scheduling.

Q: How can I get credit for a Chaffey College course if I took a similar course at another school?

A: Submit your official transcripts from your college/university and arrange an appointment with a Counselor to assist you an evaluation.
