

# STUDENT EXPLORERS

A Student Explorer is someone who has selected an Academic and Career Community, but has not yet declared a specific program of study.

## Your First Year

As an Explorer, students are given a year to explore majors and careers from a designated ACC. Students also receive 1-year course recommendations, prioritized registration and may receive one year of financial aid.

## Types of Financial Aid

### California College Promise Grant

(Formerly Board of Governor's Fee Waiver)

The California College Promise Grant program is available for qualified California residents and verified AB540 students that meet all eligibility criteria. The CCPG waives mandatory enrollment cost per unit, a portion or all of the health cost, and a portion of your parking permit for Fall and Spring semesters.

### Panther Promise

Chaffey College's Panther Promise Program provides two years of FREE tuition for all first-time college students enrolled full time (12 units). To apply visit [www.chaffey.edu/financialaid/panther-promise.php](http://www.chaffey.edu/financialaid/panther-promise.php) for eligibility requirements.

### Federal Grants

Federal Pell Grant is Federal money awarded to students based on financial need to qualified undergraduate students and in most cases, does not have to be paid back.

### FSEOG

Federal Supplemental Educational Opportunity Grant (FSEOG) is a need-based Federal Grant available to undergraduate students with the highest need.

### Federal Work Study (FWS)

Federal Work Study (FWS) is a need-based federally funded part-time employment program, which allows eligible students to earn money to help pay for education expenses. Students may work up to 20 hours per week and earn a monthly paycheck.

### State Grants

Cal Grants are state funds awarded in addition to the Federal Pell Grant. Cal Grant recipients are selected by the California Student Aid Commission (CSAC). To apply for the Cal Grant Program, you must meet

the requirements for the federal Pell Grants, submit the FAFSA and a Cal Grant GPA Verification form to CSAC by March 2nd.

### Student Success Completion Grant (SSCG)

The Student Success Completion Grant (SSCG) is a new California Community College financial aid program for students who receive a Cal Grant B or Cal Grant C and are enrolled at least full time (12+ units). The SSCG grant will provide students with additional financial aid assistance and encourage successful on-time completion. The total award amount may vary, if a student is enrolled in 12–14.99 units for a term or 15 units or more per term.

### CHAFEE Grant

The California CHAFEE Grant Program awards up to \$5,000 annually to eligible foster youth and former foster youth to use for college courses or vocational school training.

### Scholarships

Scholarships are usually, but not always, based on a combination of need and merit. Available scholarships are listed year-round on the Financial Aid website ([www.chaffey.edu](http://www.chaffey.edu), click on "Financial Aid"). Students may also contact Student Activities and the Chaffey College Foundation for other available scholarships.

### California Dream Act

The California Dream Act Application (CADAA) is used to determine the California state financial eligibility of students who meet the qualifications of Assembly Bill 540 (AB 540).

- The California Student Aid Commission (CSAC) will process this application.
- Any aid received can only be used at eligible California institutions.

# EXTENDED OPPORTUNITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

EOPS is a community college counseling program that provides “over and above” academic, personal and financial support to qualified community college students whose educational and socioeconomic backgrounds might prevent them from successfully attending college. Services provided are specifically designed for under-represented students and their specific needs with the ultimate goal being completion of a certificate program, an associate degree and/or transfer to a four-year university.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS


Meet all three of the following:

- Receive the California College Promise Grant (CCPG) A or B or California Dream Act A or B
- Have less than 70 degree-applicable units completed (students who have completed an associate’s or bachelor’s degree are not eligible to the program)
- Be enrolled in a minimum of 12 units each fall and spring semester

AND ONE (1) OF THE FOLLOWING:

- Be a student who has not earned a high school diploma or equivalent
- Have a high school grade-point average below 2.5
- Complete remedial/foundational course work in high school or college
- Complete English as a Second Language courses (ESL)
- Be a current or former foster youth
- Be a first-generation college student  
(a student whose parents or guardians have not completed a college degree).

- Apply on-line by logging onto your My Chaffey portal account at my.chaffey.edu (a Chaffey student ID number is required)
- Scroll the left sidebar to Tools
- Locate the EOPS application link under Student Quick Links
- Once you submit your application, you will receive a confirmation email verifying that your application was successfully submitted. Please save it for your records.
- It takes eight to twelve weeks to process your application and determine your eligibility
- You will be notified via your Panther email, or the email Chaffey College has on file, of your application status

# DISABILITY PROGRAMS AND SERVICES

If you have developmental, learning, physical and psychological disabilities, that shouldn't stop you from achieving your educational, career or life goals. That's where Disability Programs and Services (DPS) comes in. We can give you skills and knowledge to reach your full potential and be independent. You can use these skills to get a college degree or vocational training to get a job.

DPS serves disabled students in accordance with Title 5 regulations and the Americans with Disabilities Act of 1990. Faculty and staff can also use DPS as a resource to meet the needs of their disabled students. We aim to give our students the same quality education as any other student and a big part of this comes from building awareness across the campus community about human rights and equal access. Your ability counts - not your disability.

## ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

To be eligible for the program, you must have a disability verified by a physician, psychologist or other appropriate professional (Title 5, section 56006).

If you have a learning disability, you should bring copies of your test results. Moreover, if you believe you have a learning disability, but have not been tested, we administer the test at our facilities for community college eligibility purposes only (subject to availability).

Students who may qualify for services include, but are not limited to, the following disabilities:

- Physical Disability
- Communication Disability
- Learning Disability
- Acquired Brain Injury
- Developmentally Delayed Learner
- Psychological Disability
- Other Disabilities

If you have a physical, psychological or communicative disability, you must submit medical verification of your disability from a physician, psychologist or other appropriate professional in the application link below: If you have a learning disability, you will need to submit your psychological evaluation report with testing scores or a score report from a certified LD specialist when you submit your online application.

Meet with one of our DPS Counselors for coordination of services and/or equipment, and academic planning.

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InTech is the first public-private partnership in the California Community College System and possibly in the U.S.; it has attracted national and international attention. InTech provides in-demand technical training and professional development programs that include nationally recognized stackable certifications and lead to good paying careers.

Chaffey College and California Steel Industries, Inc. (CSI) have had a long-standing, successful partnership for almost twenty years. In 2014, a grant opportunity allowed them to formalize the partnership and used Department of Labor TAACCCT funds to renovate CSI's old administration building and create a regional training center. The InTech Center is located on CSI's property and is a 33,000 square foot facility with six classrooms, a computer lab, mechatronics lab, electrical lab and mechanical lab.

### **Industrial Electrical and Mechanical Pre-Apprenticeship**

This program, approved by the California Division of Apprenticeship Standards (DAS), is designed to prepare individuals for industrial mechanical and the fundamentals of electricity. It prepares individuals for entry-level positions in manufacturing, distribution and other industries.

### **Introduction to Welding** (*Halted until Summer 2026*)

This program prepares individuals for entry level welding positions in various industries, including manufacturing, utilities, construction, fabrication and national defense. The program includes two American Welding Society (AWS) industry recognized welding qualifications.
