

California General Education Transfer Curriculum (Cal-GETC) 2025-2026

The Cal-GETC is the singular lower division general education pathway for California Community College (CCC) students transferring to the California State University (CSU) or the University of California (UC).

- 1. Transfer to the CSU or UC system typically involves achieving junior standing by completing 60 transferrable units, including general education, major preparation, and/or electives. For the CSU system, 60 CSU-transferrable units must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.0. For the UC system, 60 UC-transferrable units must be completed with a minimum GPA of 2.4. Up to 70 lower-division units may be applied to the bachelor's degree after transfer. See College Catalog for course transferability.
- 2. Cal-GETC certification requires completion of all requirements passed with a minimum grade of C prior to transfer.
- 3. Partial Cal-GETC certification is not granted.
- 4. Cal-GETC certification is not a requirement for admission to most UCs and CSUs. See an Academic Counselor for details.
- 5. Students whose majors require more than 30 units are encouraged to see an Academic Counselor and/or visit assist.org regarding the advisability of completing all major requirements instead of all general education requirements.
- 6. A course must be taken during a term approved for Cal-GETC (see assist.org). A course may be approved in multiple Cal-GETC Areas, but can only be used to satisfy a single Area 1-6 requirement. IGETC courses taken prior to Fall 2025 may be applied in the same Cal-GETC Area for certification, including courses that are not officially included in Cal-GETC or are no longer active.
