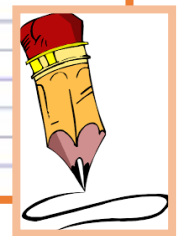
Neil's schedule is very busy. He doesn't have much free time, but he loves his work. He works for the University of Southern California.
