CHRISTA HAVENHILL

After many years of performing, teaching, and auditioning, Professor Christa Havenhill of the Theatre Department finally landed the Hero role in a National commercial. She could not be more appreciative of the opportunity and proud of her efforts.

Ingrezza, a new treatment for Tardive Dyskinesia, began airing nationwide on May 17 and features Christa as the main character suffering from the disease. TD patients suffer from uncontrollable movements most often seen in the face and hands. A major component of the audition and callback required demonstrating the intricate movements in varying degrees to the casting directors, director, product and agency clients, and a licensed doctor. All auditions took place live on Zoom.

Once booked, Christa attended two rehearsals, was fitted for wardrobe, and remained in quarantine as to not contract COVID-19 and forfeit the role. She was tested every two days while an understudy stood by.

The filming took place over the course of five days and employed an exceptionally large production team. The director Robert Stromberg worked closely with Christa mediating the needs of the clients, technicians, and other talent on set. Stromberg is best known for his direction on Disney's Maleficent and art design on Avatar. Dr. Leslie watched each take and helped Christa make any necessary corrections to her movements. Accurate disease representation remained at the forefront of the project and required many eyes and multiple takes.

In addition to the commercial, Christa currently appears on the Ingrezza website as the main patient seeking help.

Christa hopes to inspire her students to follow their dreams and realize that sometimes they may come to fruition a little later than originally planned.

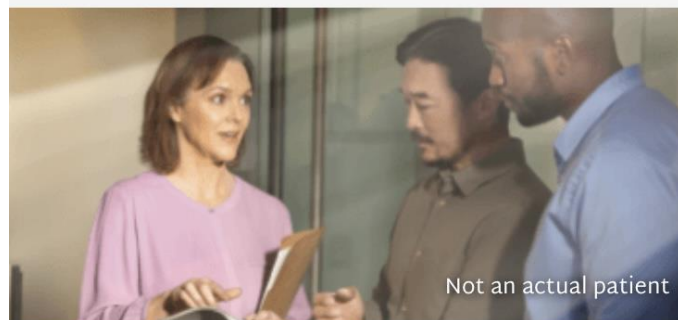
