B. Amendments for Resolutions from Area Meetings Packet

1. Section 3 DIVERSITY AND EQUITY

- +3.03.01 Add a 4th resolved statement
 - Resolved, That the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges advocate for mental health resources and services including funding, professional development, and support for community college faculty.
- +3.05.01 Amend the 3rd resolved statement
 - Resolved, That the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges encourage the use of approaches that significantly reduce course resource costs such that any course sections ~~with a low cost~~ can obtain zero-textbook-cost status by virtue of the cost of resources for that course being absorbed by the college, district, or the state.

2. Section 13 GENERAL CONCERNS

- +13.01.01 Delete the current resolved statement and replace with a new resolved statement
 - Resolved, That the Academic Senate for California Community Colleges encourage local academic senates to remind their constituents that the accuracy and timeliness of information in the schedule of classes helps their students succeed, especially for all zero and low-cost designated courses, and develop processes to support this effort.

3. Section 19 PROFESSIONAL STANDARDS

- +19.01.01 Amend the 1st whereas statement
 - Whereas, Education Code §87360 Hiring Criteria, Subdivision (a), states that applicants for faculty and administrator positions must meet two minimum qualifications for employment at California Community Colleges: a discipline-specific qualification aligned with minimum discipline standards set in the Minimum Qualifications for Faculty and Administrators in the California Community Colleges and demonstrate, as a criterion for hiring “beyond the state minimum qualifications, a sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, disability, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students” (CA Ed Code §87360(a)), that is included in all job announcements and assessed during the applicant screening process, per the requirements of Title 5, §§53022 and 53024; yet current faculty screening and selection practices at most colleges

may place a disproportionate emphasis focus solely on discipline-specific hiring criteria, such as the ability to teach and provide services to students, at the expense of assessing job applicants and candidates on their abilities to “demonstrate a sensitivity to and understanding of the diverse academic, socioeconomic, cultural, disability, and ethnic backgrounds of community college students”; ~~on the discipline-specific minimum qualification; and~~

Textbook Transformation Project

Faculty Senate Update

The Problem

In light of our interdisciplinary research and focus groups, we found the following;

1. Faculty need accurate understanding of OER/ZTC/LCT designation
 - a. **Solutions:** Creating infographic and resource materials with definitions of terms/how to report materials
 - b. **Solutions:** OER/ZTC Certification development
2. Faculty reporting of ZTC/OER/LTC materials inaccurate caused by confusion in designations
 - a. **Solutions:** Creating infographic and resource materials with definitions of terms/how to report materials
 - b. **Solutions:** Proposed revised workflow
3. Inaccurate state reporting - can impact state funding / impacts following of SB 1359
 - a. **Solutions:** New field in Colleague regarding course costs & ZTC/OER/LTC designation
 - b. **Solutions:** Proposed revised workflow
4. Incomplete campus store reporting (again because of confusion) / impacts students
 - a. **Solutions:** New field in Colleague regarding course costs
 - b. **Solutions:** Proposed revised workflow

TTP Initial Data & Reporting

- **SB 1359 requirement not fulfilled**

- All course sections that exclusively use digital course materials that are free of charge to students be noted as such in the online course schedule
- *"Yes, but [we are] not confident that all sections are marked appropriately."*

- **The current process of data collection and reporting**

- *"There is no existing process and guidelines on what constitutes a no-cost section have not been provided"*
- *Courses that do not use a text are marked with the no-cost designation*
- *Institutional Research data is inaccurate*
- *Campus Store collection is incomplete and/or inaccurate*
- *Faculty need accurate understanding of OER/ZTC/LCT designation*

- **Extent of Institutional Support**

- Yes - OER Liaisons; OER/ZTC Workgroup
- No - Release time for faculty to support OER efforts; Student workers, faculty, staff, administration who is focused solely on OER efforts

Solution: Advocate for more ZTC/OER Support - Faculty reassign time with classified help

Additional TTP Commitments

1. **Accessibility of ZTC/OER/LTC materials**

- a. Partnership with DPS
- b. Vetting of materials for accessibility / creation of accessible materials

2. **Representation in authorship of materials**

- a. Equitable, culturally responsive materials that are representative of diverse experiences, identities, communities, voices, and self expressions

3. **Currency of materials for discipline specific research**

- a. Consistent evaluation process of materials to maintain reliable and accurate representation of current standards within discipline fields of research
