Since 2004 Chaffey College has been committed to supporting system impacted students both during and after incarceration by offering opportunities to pursue associate's degrees and certificate programs. Students served include those at the California Institution for Women (CIW) and the California Institution for Men (CIM).


Chaffey also launched the Rising Scholars program in 2021, which provides support to formerly incarcerated and system-impacted students. Turning Point and Rising Scholars students have access to specialized tutoring, counseling, financial aid, and admissions and records services with key staff and faculty who are dedicated to serving them as they pursue their academic and career goals.

Turning Point




Total number of incarcerated students


Incarcerated students served per year:




Students enrolled at CIW:




Students enrolled at CIM:
























Coming in Fall 2022:

2+2 Partnership between Chaffey College and Cal State University, Los Angeles at CIW For the first time in the state of California, students at the California Institution for Women (CIW) will have the opportunity to go directly into a bachelor's degree program with CSU Los Angeles upon finishing their associates degree with Chaffey. The "2+2 Partnership" between Chaffey College and CSU Los Angeles will provide a pathway for our incarcerated students to complete their associate's and bachelor's degrees within four years.
