Things to keep in mind when running an election

- If someone nominates a candidate, email that candidate to make sure they accept the nomination.
- If more than one candidate is nominated, there needs to be an election that lasts 7 days.
 - It is helpful to ask candidates to write a statement (200 words or less) to support their candidacy. This is not a requirement, only a suggestion.
- If only one candidate is nominated, they will win by acclamation and no balloting needs to occur.
- Full Time and Part Time Faculty can nominate a Full Time Faculty Candidate. Only Full Time Faculty can vote during balloting.
- Departments can reach out to their Dean's offices for email lists

Chapter 6, Business and Fiscal Affairs

AP 6620 Naming of Facilities

Proposals for naming of buildings, structures, or facilities of the District shall be submitted to the Governing Board, who will refer them to the Facilities Naming Committee.

The Facilities Naming Committee shall consist of the Superintendent/President or designee, who will serve as chair, and the presidents or their designees from the following groups: Academic Senate, Chaffey College Faculty Association, Classified Senate, California School Employees Association, Chaffey College Student Government, the Chaffey College Foundation Board, and/or other individuals appointed by the Superintendent/President. After study and consideration, the Facilities Naming Committee will make recommendations to accept, deny, or modify the proposal for naming of the building, structure, or facility to the Superintendent/President, or designee. A recommendation to accept the proposal will be forwarded to the Governing Board by the Superintendent/President, or designee. Academic Senate suggests the addition of a reasonable timeline from the application to final decision be added to this AP.

A building, structure, or facility may be named in honor of the achievement of unique distinction in higher education, or other significant areas of public service, or extraordinary contributions to the District, which warrant special recognition. A building, structure, or facility may also be named in honor of a significant gift.

An appropriate relationship between the use of the facility or its function and the person or organization for whom it will be named should exist. In the event that the proposal is to name a building, structure, or facility for a former faculty, staff, or Governing Board member, the individual will not be considered for this honor until at least one year after the individual's separation from the District.

Proposals for the naming of facilities should include a brief biography of the person(s) or the history of the organization and the rationale for the proposal; i.e., the ways in which the criteria above are met. Proposal forms are available in the Office of the Superintendent/President.

Removal of Names from Donor-Named Buildings, Facilities, and Grounds

The District may, in its sole discretion, change a name, or remove a name from a donornamed building, facility, ground or other space if the building, facility, grounds, or other space is destroyed or razed, or must be substantially remodeled or rebuilt for any reason. In that situation, the District will acknowledge the donor's contribution with a

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plaque in a prominent location in a replacement building, facility, grounds, or elsewhere on the District's campus.

The District has the absolute right and authority to remove a name from a donor-named building, facility, ground, or other space and rename it as it sees fit, if the donor fails to make the promised donation or gift for any reason. The District also has the absolute right and authority to remove a name from a donor-named building, facility, ground or other space and rename it as it sees fit, if the District determines, in its sole discretion, that the District's continued association with the name, the donor, or the donor's family or business, will damage the District's reputation or goodwill in the community.

Academic Senate Resolution- Action Plan for Increasing Library Staffing in Accordance with Title 5

Whereas, the Academic Senate of California Community Colleges supports that "Librarians are central to education as they provide a safe and inclusive environment for students to bring questions about their courses, explore new ideas, and learn to become information literate in a quickly changing world," [1] and research indicates library resources and instruction are related to improved student success and retention;

Whereas Chaffey College BP4040 states that the district will provide "library and learning support services that are an integral part of the institution's educational program" [2];

Whereas the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs states, "The library is an educational facility [...] as such, it cannot operate without library faculty in place. A library, like a classroom, should not be in use unless library faculty are available to provide service and facilitate student learning" [3];

Whereas Chaffey College libraries have not been staffed in accordance with California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724 [4] for at least 10 years, which sets forth the minimum staffing levels for certificated and classified staffing in libraries and media centers, and that the minimum number of staff for a library serving 13,000 FTES is 15.0 staff while Chaffey College Libraries have 5.5 staff;

Whereas libraries are required to have a certificated librarian present during all hours the library is open by Chaffey College AP 4040 [5], California Education Code [6], and the ASCCC Standards of Practice for California Community College Library Faculty and Programs [3];

Whereas Chaffey College Administrative Procedure 4040 states that Chaffey College Library will comply with the California Code of Regulations [5];

Whereas Chaffey College is continually growing to include new locations, buildings, and services that need to be adequately staffed per regulations;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate advocates for an action plan to reach district compliance with the library staffing minimum standards set forward in California Code of Regulations, title 5, §58724; such an action plan should be created by a work group established by March 2024 which is comprised of library managers, library faculty, and library staff, with said action plan finalized no later than October 2024;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate recommends that the district hire an additional 2.0 FTE classified library clerk II positions by Fall 2024 to work in good faith towards said compliance;

Resolved that the Chaffey College Academic Senate urges that the library locations should not be opened nor remain open unless at least one (1) classified library clerk and one (1) library faculty are concurrently present in the building in accordance with said California regulations, CCC policies, and Chaffey College procedures.

Academic Senate

The Academic Senate represents faculty in all academic and professional matters. Activities and responsibilities may include or go beyond the following (referred to as the 10+2):

- Curriculum, including establishing prerequisites and placing courses within disciplines
- 2. Degree & Certificate Requirements
- 3. Grading Policies
- 4. Educational Program Development
- Standards or Polices regarding Student Preparation and Success
- 6. District and College governance structures, as related to faculty roles
 - a. The appointment of faculty members to serve on college committees, task forces, or other groups dealing with academic and professional matters shall be made by the Academic Senate in consultation with the Superintendent/President or designee.
 - b. There are some areas where the Faculty Association may appoint faculty to committees.
- Faculty roles and involvement in accreditation processes, including self-study and annual reports
- 8. Policies for faculty professional development activities
- 9. Processes for program review
- Processes for institutional planning and budget development
- 11. Other academic and professional matters as mutually agreed upon between the governing board and the academic senate.
- 12. Hiring criteria, policies, procedures, and equivalencies for new faculty members shall be developed, updated, and agreed upon jointly by representatives of the Governing Board and Academic Senate. (Unique to Chaffey and is not included as the statewide 10 +1).

Chaffey College Faculty Association

The Chaffey College Faculty Association is responsible for negotiating the wages, hours, working conditions, and employee/employer relations of all faculty.

The primary purposes of this Association shall be:

- To represent its members in their relations with their employer, and to be the exclusive representative of appropriate units of school employees in all matters relating to employment conditions and employer-employee relations including, but not limited to, wages, hours, and other terms and conditions of employment.
- To form a representative body capable of developing group opinion on professional matters to speak with authority for faculty members;
- 3. To provide an opportunity for continuous study and action on problems of the profession;
- 4. To provide a means of representation for its ethnic minority members;
- 5. To promote professional attitudes and ethical conduct among members;
- 6. To encourage cooperation and communication between the profession and the community;
- 7. To foster good fellowship among members.

CCFA works closely with the Chaffey's Academic Senate to promote faculty involvement across the college. Both the Faculty Association and the Academic Senate strongly believe in participatory governance and consider faculty leadership from all areas of the college vital to providing a quality education to our students. This unified faculty voice promotes the well-being of the whole college community to our administration and Governing Board.

Meritorious Service Award

Academic Senate has acknowledged faculty members through meritorious service awards since the inception of the awards in 1986/87. All full-time faculty, living or deceased, who have been retired for at least one full year or who have died while in service, are eligible for the Meritorious Service Award. Faculty receiving this prestigious honor have clearly shown meritorious service in at least two of the following three areas: Superior Teaching or Job Performance, Professional Achievement, and/or College Service. In order that future students and staff will remember their outstanding contributions to Chaffey, their name is placed on the Meritorious Service perpetual plaque that hangs in the library.

Meritorious Service Award Guidelines

Criteria Applications shall clearly show meritorious service in at **least two of the following three areas**, one of which must include Section 3.1. Clear indications in all three may strengthen a nomination.

Criteria to be used in evaluating applications are:

3.1 Superior teaching or job performance

- 3.1.1 Examples of meritorious performance include, but are not limited to, excellence in classroom teaching, significant curricular development, instructional innovations and/or successful completion of special projects or assignments, and significant individual assistance to and/or interaction with students in the learning process.
- 3.1.2 Examples of professional commitment include, but are not limited to, having furthered education by attending special courses and institutes or participating in major professional conferences; projects or developmental materials related to contracts, grants or fellowships for instructionally related work or job performance; other appropriate items related to instruction or job performance.

3.2 Professional Achievement

3.2.1 Examples of scholarly performance include, but are not limited to, publication of juried, refereed, and/or reviewed work; noteworthy exhibitions, performance, and/or other creative work; offices held in professional organizations; panel discussions or workshops organized for professional meetings; active participation in professional meetings (i.e., delivered papers, addresses, etc.); academic innovation in general and/or other appropriate materials related to professional growth.

3.2.2 Examples of academic achievement include, but are not limited to, significant research, investigative activity or creative activity; contract, grant or fellowship-sponsored activity successfully concluded; editing or consulting activity of a scholarly nature; active participation in research related conferences, courses or institutes; and other appropriate activity of an outstanding nature.

3.3 College Service

- 3.3.1 Examples of meritorious performance include, but are not limited to, exceptional leadership in college, governance and campus life at the department, division, campus, and/or state levels; and/or other exceptional service consistent with the college mission.
- 3.3.2 Examples of professional achievement include, but are not limited to, developmental working a service-related project within the college (department, division, campus and/or system); developmental work in a service-related project in the off-campus community (recruitment, outreach, public relations, governmental, etc.); other activity which is likely to produce exceptional service to the college and/or surrounding community.
