7. Report(s)

7.1. President

7.1.1. Tuesday, March 10, the Academic Senate meeting will be cancelled in place of the Tenure Reception Ceremony. We have 18 faculty members getting honored with receiving tenure this year, some of whom are Senators as well! We hope to see everyone at the Tenure Reception event on Tuesday, March 10, from 12:30 - 2 pm in the FSC at the LLC.

We are also hoping to have some Senators sign up to help with tasks: 1 Greeter (Myra), 2 Cake Cutters/Servers (Justin and Jonny), 1 Photographer, and 2 to help with clean up after the event (Steve, Henry).

AP 4240 Academic Renewal is moving through the Governance Process, as CIO McClellan informed me this morning, it should be going to the President's Cabinet within the next few months.

7.2. Vice President

7.2.1. The end of the nomination period for most, if not all, elections. There has been one nominee for most elections; some areas received no nominees, which will have vacancies. Vacancies in any area (Senators At Large, Area Representatives, Alternates, etc.) can be filled at any point in the Academic Year and do not need to wait for an election cycle to be filled. If Senators have a constituent who is interested in getting involved “mid-cycle” and wants to fill a vacancy, they can reach out to VP Overduin and cc Lissa Napoli to put the individual on the agenda to be ratified in the vacant representative seat.

Ratification for Senator elections will happen in March, after the election period for the Faculty Lecturer of the Year elections has concluded. There are currently 4 nominees for the Faculty Lecturer of the Year.

The Dual Enrollment Committee was discussed as having a connection to areas 1, 4, 5, and 12, while the Health and Safety Committee was not found to have any connection to the 10+2 areas of the Academic Senate.

8.2.2 Pamela Valfer (Fall 2025) Reviewers: Senators Doget and Polidano

Senator Polidano shared that he and Senator Doget read Pamela's sabbatical report. They found that the sabbatical successfully met all the objectives outlined in Pamela's original proposal. Her work was multifaceted, focusing on transposing and generating original music compositions for the Chamber Choir. Additionally, she coordinated with various venues to secure potential theater locations for future student performances.

One of the most impressive outcomes was how she integrated her findings into her art curriculum. She developed a unique series of activities where students listen to different arrangements of the same song and translate the varying musical tones into distinct visual art compositions.

While we identified a few minor typos initially, Pamela resolved these over the weekend. We have no further concerns and formally recommend that the report be moved forward to the CIO for final approval.

Although she has already received the award, she should have been included as the list serves as a comprehensive record of previous honorees.

I have been in contact with Human Resources regarding this discrepancy. They acknowledged an error in their data query, and while they are still working to resolve the technical issue, we are granting them some grace given their current workload. We expect to present a corrected, complete list next week.

 1. Superior teaching or job performance.
 2. Professional achievement.
 3. College service.
- Recognition: Honorees are commemorated on the Meritorious Service perpetual plaque located in the Library (LLC).
