- 1. Call to Order/Roll Call: The meeting was called to order at 1:37p.m.
- 2. Public Comment (Reserved for guests to address any item on the agenda for a limit of two minutes): None.
- 3. Review and Approval of March 8, 2023 Expanded Summary Notes: The summary notes were approved 11/0/3.

4. Curriculum Office Reports

4.1. Curriculum Chair:

- 1. Curriculum Committee Members' Tenure Congratulations: The Chair congratulated the committee members who earned tenure this year: Christina Holdiness, Grace Wong, Kirk Collins, and Markazan Romero. She also congratulated Christy McPeck who is going on sabbatical next year.
- 2. <u>2023-2024 Elections Update</u> and Welcome of New Members: The Chair welcomed Marlene Soto, Jennika Celo, Garrett Kenehan, and Elaine Martinez who will be new members next year. She thanked both the returning members for their continued service, and thanked the members who will no longer serve on the committee for their dedication and hard work during their terms.
- 3. <u>Curriculum Committee Self-Evaluation</u>: The Chair asked the committee to participate in the committee self-evaluation through the CPC survey.

4. <u>Physical Therapist Assistant Program Presentation</u>: The Chair shared the highlights of the newly approved PTA program. The presentation was not ready at the time the new program was approved.

4.2. Curriculum Specialist:

- Academic Senate/Curriculum Committee Retreat (August 11, 2023): The Specialist shared that Academic Senate and the Curriculum Committee will have a joined retreat. It will likely be from 8:30-12:30 in CAA-218. A calendar invitation will be sent to the committee in a couple of weeks. Lissa Napoli will send the invitation to senators.
- 2. Curriculum Submission Timeline Update: The Specialist thanked the faculty, coordinator, and deans in this update cycle for ensuring majority of the proposals were submitted by the deadline. They made the cycle seamless and their partnership is extremely appreciated.
- 3. <u>2023 ASCCC Annual Curriculum Institute</u>: She encouraged Curriculum Committee members to attend. Those interested in attending should speak to their dean regarding budgeting and the travel and conference paperwork. The Institute will be at the Riverside Convention Center on Wednesday July 12, 2023 to Saturday July 15, 2023.
- 4. <u>IDEA Dashboard Tool</u>: The Classified Success Network Advisory Committee (CSNAC) shared this helpful guide on the IDEA dashboard. Ariel Sales in Institutional Research submitted the informative graphic.
- 5. The Library, Allison Tripp and the Anthropology Club, and the Gym have partnered for a clothing exchange for Earth Day. They will collect gently used washed clothing at the Rancho Campus Library to be distributed on Earth Day. Joann Eisberg shared that this is a good example of sustainably. Sustainably can be addressed in CORs such as in the assignments or learning outcomes (aligns with one of the ACES).
- 6. The Specialist thanked the committee for their extraordinary work. She feels very lucky to work with such an amazing group and she looks forward to continuing the work next year.

7. Discussion/Action Items:

- **7.1.** Summer Clean Up: Over the summer, the Curriculum Office, the Articulation Office, and the Catalog and Schedule Coordinator will have "summer clean up". This includes updating the GE patterns with the updated approvals, ensuring courses are displaying appropriately in the catalog/schedule, Chancellor's Office revision requests, to name a few. This annual clean-up will correct any inconsistencies in our internal and external curriculum processes. All clean-up projects will be reported to the committee in the fall. The Committee approved summer clean-up 16/0/0.
- **7.2.** Curriculum Committee Wrap-Up (Summative Report): The Chair and Specialist shared a summative work on the transformational work done by the Committee and the faculty in MIT, PCS, and HWA for the standard update cycle. Their focus on DEIA in CORS has led to systemic changes in DEIA. The Specialist read the following statement to the Committee:

The Curriculum Office commends the Curriculum Committee for their dedicated work in reading, reviewing, and approving 1,019 proposals while ensuring equity was at the center of their review. The Curriculum Committee has been instrumental in creating systemic DEIA changes in curriculum. For each department in MIT, PCS, HWA, committee members were committed to ensuring DEIA was in every program by reviewing each course with an equity lens. Members provided commendations to faculty who had DEIA in their curriculum. In addition to commendations, committee members provided thoughtful and collegial feedback on ways to incorporate DEIA into courses. Suggestions included adding DEIA to content, assignments, CLOs, and objectives. The Curriculum Committee's dedication to ensuring that DEIA is in each department's curriculum is truly a catalyst to systemic equity changes.

The Curriculum Office would like to thank faculty, deans, coordinators, and the Curriculum Committee for working together to ensure the college maintains compliance with curriculum legislation, ensure the curriculum process supports external processes impacted by curriculum, and for the dedication to incorporating DEIA into their

curriculum. Everyone's committed work during this cycle is a true representation of our collegial partnership in providing students the optimal classroom experience.
