- **6.4.** For the publication of the 2025-2026 Catalog:

As discussed with the department during the creation of these courses, and at the December 4, 2024 curriculum meeting, KINLEC-3, KINLEC-4, and KINLEC-5 have been removed from the Physical Education AA until a decision has been made by state-level GE reviewers. If any courses are approved by the GE reviewers, the course(s) will be added back to the Physical Education AA.

Upon the Art History faculty's return and the hiring of a full-time faculty member for Economics, the Curriculum Office will invite these faculty to review the courses and incorporate any desired Part II components, which will then be resubmitted to the CCCCO.

### 11. Discussion/Information/Action Items:

# 11.1. Common Course Numbering Update:

- 1. Phase II (Group A and Group B)
  - Group A (finalized March 2025): 7 Chaffey Courses for Fall 2026 Implementation (see above).
  - Group B: Courses that are deemed more difficult to finalize. An ASCCC survey will be sent to faculty for more feedback. Colleges will likely receive notice in May for Fall 2027 implementation.

### 2. Phase III

- Final list of courses sent to CIOs in February. Templates should be finalized February/March 2026 for Fall 2027 Implementation.
- 11.2. Location of ZTC Language in META/COR: The Chair suggested that the newly approved Zero Textbook Cost (ZTC) language, which was passed via consent agenda, be located to the top of the course outline of record (COR) under the Distance Education section. This change would highlight the ZTC commitment. During the discussion, a committee member raised a concern about how to proceed in cases where there is no commitment for all sections of a course to be offered as ZTC. Options considered included stating "none" in the ZTC field or omitting that ZTC section from the CORs that do not have a commitment to have all sections use ZTC. Some members expressed support for including a clarifying statement when ZTC is not required for all sections: "ZTC options are encouraged but not required for this course." This recommendation, along with the proposed relocation of the ZTC language, was approved by acclamation, 12/0/0.
- **11.3.** General Education Workgroup Update: The Chair presented the proposed revision to the Chaffey General Education (GE) format, aligning Chaffey's GE category names with those used in the Cal-GETC framework. The proposal was approved by acclamation, 12/0/0.

### 12. What's Next?

- **12.1.** 9<sup>th</sup> Annual Curriculum Committee Retreat (Mandatory) in partnership with Academic Senate: Friday, August 8, 2025, CAA-218, 8:00-12:00 (4 hours of FLEX Credit)
  - 1. Retreat will be in-person only.
  - 2. There is an asynchronous Canvas Shell that supplements the Retreat to provide the training needed to serve on the Committee. Each member (both new and returning) **must** complete and pass a quiz prior to the start of the first curriculum meeting in the fall (TBD). The quiz is "open book" and can be taken as many times as needed. A passing score of at least 75% is needed.
  - 3. If there is certain material you would like covered during the retreat, please provide your suggestions by the end of the semester. We cannot guarantee that suggestions will be included.
- 12.2. Curriculum Committee Members will receive next year's meeting dates via Outlook during the summer.
- **13. Floor Items:** (Reserved to raise concerns and/or future items to discuss within the <u>Curriculum Committee Scope</u>. Committee members may also use floor items to share committee work and departmental/institutional updates as it relates to the Committee's work. Concerns and/or items to discuss may appear on a future agenda).
  - 13.1. Matthew Caddell reported that the Chaffey Community Student Government (CCSG) recently visited Washington, D.C., where they met with various political figures to advocate for federal aid. They are also working to invite Norma Torres to Chaffey. Additionally, resolutions addressing sustainability and support for student athletes were passed at the statewide student government level. Today marks Matt's final meeting, as he is running unopposed for CCSG President. The Committee expressed their gratitude for his outstanding contributions and wished him continued success in his future endeavors.

- **13.2.** Christina Holdiness, a member of the Student Equity Plan workgroup, expressed concern about how curriculum changes, particularly course deactivations, affect Educational Plans. Sharon Alton acknowledged the Curriculum Office for its efforts in keeping student academic maps up to date.
- **14. Adjournment:** The meeting was adjourned at 3:00p.m.
