WHAT IS COPYRIGHT ?

Basically - Copyright protects original and creative works, and it gives the copyright owner the right to (and to give permission to):

- Make copies of the work
- Prepare derivative works based on the original work
- Distribute the work
- Publicly display the work
- Publicly perform the work



COPYRIGHT INFRINGEME NT IN A NUTSHELL

Whenever material is redistributed, copied, derived from, performed, displayed, without the copyright owner's permission is copyright infringement.

Are OER protected by copyright?

PUBLIC DOMAIN WORKS CAN BE OER



Works that are no longer protected by copyright = public domain



All works first published or released before January 1, 1925



Creators can release work into the public domain.



And then there's a whole bunch of separate dates and exceptions...



CREATIVE COMMONS LICENSING



Creative Commons licenses are the most common licenses for OER.



They work with copyright – not against copyright



They make permissions transparent for reuse



Anyone can use and assign them freely to their own works





CAN I USE WORKS WITHOUT KNOWING THEIR COPYRIGHT PERMISSIONS?





PIRATED WORKS

Works that are illegally shared online

Avoid using these





The unauthorized reproduction or distribution of this copyrighted work is illegal. Criminal copyright infringement, including infringement without monetary gain, is investigated by the FBI and is punishable by up to 5 years in federal prison and a fine of \$250,000.



COPYRIGHT EXCEPTIONS





FAIR USE

TEACH ACT



TEACH ACT



Makes using copyrighted material while teaching online more "permissible"



Only applies to PERFORMANCE and DISPLAY permissions of copyright



Perform: non-dramatic literary and non-dramatic musical works in their entirety



Display works: permits just as you would in a face-to-face class.



TEACH ACT REQUIREMENTS



Access must be limited / controlled



Copyright policies must be in place for students/faculty



Copyright needs an informative component



Copyright notices must accompany all materials used.



Fair Use



Fair Use is CASE BY CASE



Only a court can truly determine the final application of it.



Use your best judgment
