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Section 1: Enrollment and Success Metrics



The 2023-2024 year saw a large increase in enrollments and headcounts.

For 2023-2024, course success rate increased by 3.8% compared to the prior year, but the persistence rate declined slightly.



Figure 1: Course Success Rate and Retention Rate





Figure 2: Persistence Rate

Course Retention Rates represent the percentage of students who remained in the class until the end.

Figure 3: Fall Term Enrollment Status





Figure 4: Spring Term Enrollment Status

Figure 5: Student Headcount by Age




Figure 6: Student Headcount by Ethnicity





Figure 7: Student Headcount by Gender


First Generation, Umoja, and Veterans saw the largest increases compared to the previous year.



Figure 10: Count of Transfers By Institution Type





The percentage of enrolled students that have an ed plan is less than the previous year.

Although the number of students with education plans increased by 6.1%, the proportion of **enrolled** students with an ed plan declined to 57.8%. This is due to the growth of overall headcount which was 9.9%.

Figure 13: 2023 – 2024 Service Area Map (Headcount)




