Overview

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Section 1: Enrollment and Success Metrics



The 2024-2025 year saw a large increase in enrollments and headcounts.

Figure 1: Course Success Rate and Retention Rate





Figure 2: Persistence Rate

Figure 3: Fall Term Enrollment Status





Figure 4: Spring Term Enrollment Status

Figure 5: Student Headcount by Age




Figure 6: Student Headcount by Ethnicity





Figure 7: Student Headcount by Gender

Section 3: Special Populations


The college served more Formerly Incarcerated and Umoja students, while the Veteran student population saw a slight decline.



Figure 10: Count of Transfers By Institution Type





Figure 13: 2024 – 2025 Service Area Map (Headcount)




