Overview

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Section 1: Enrollment and Success Metrics



Headcounts and enrollments continued their upward trend in 2025-2026, while the district shifted focus to efficiency over growth.

Figure 1: Course Success Rate and Retention Rate

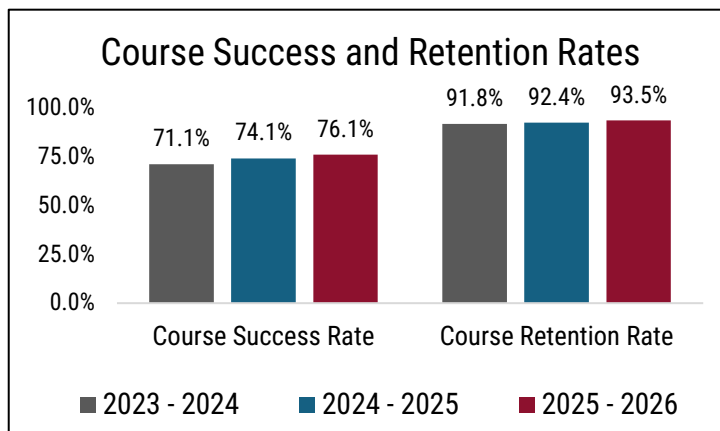
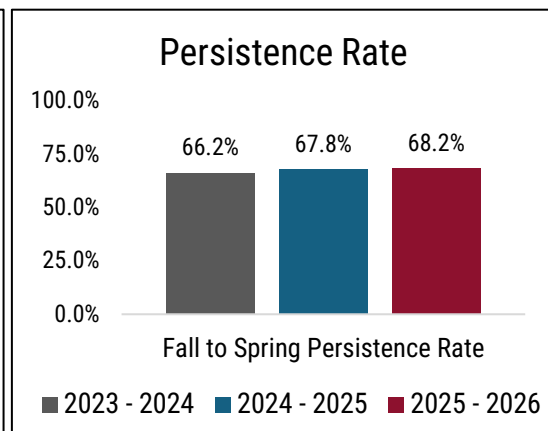


Figure 2: Persistence Rate

Figure 3: Fall Term Enrollment Status

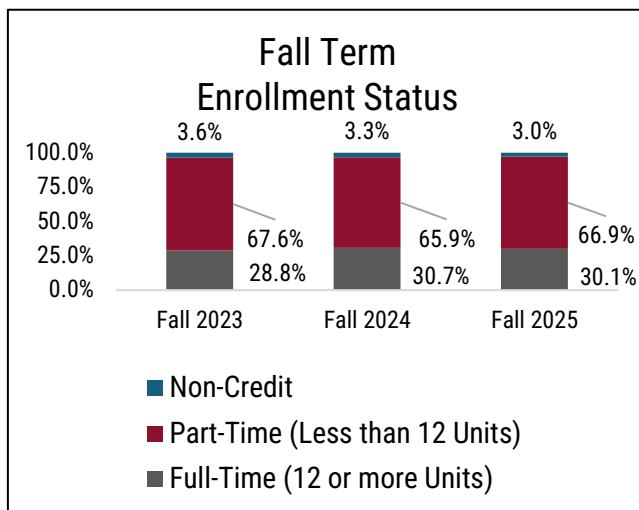
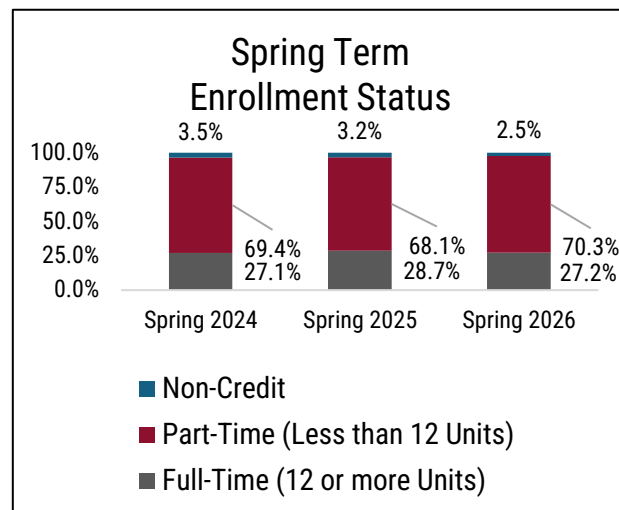


Figure 4: Spring Term Enrollment Status

Figure 5: Student Headcount by Age

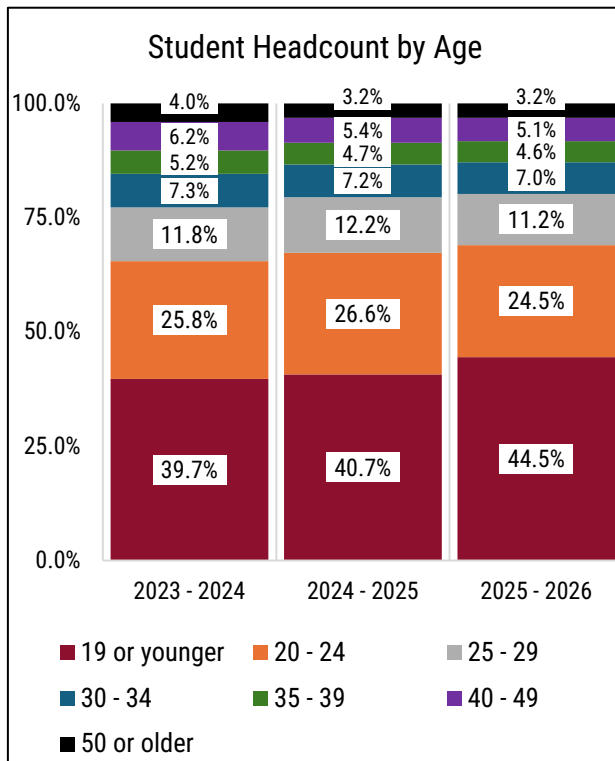


Figure 6: Student Headcount by Ethnicity

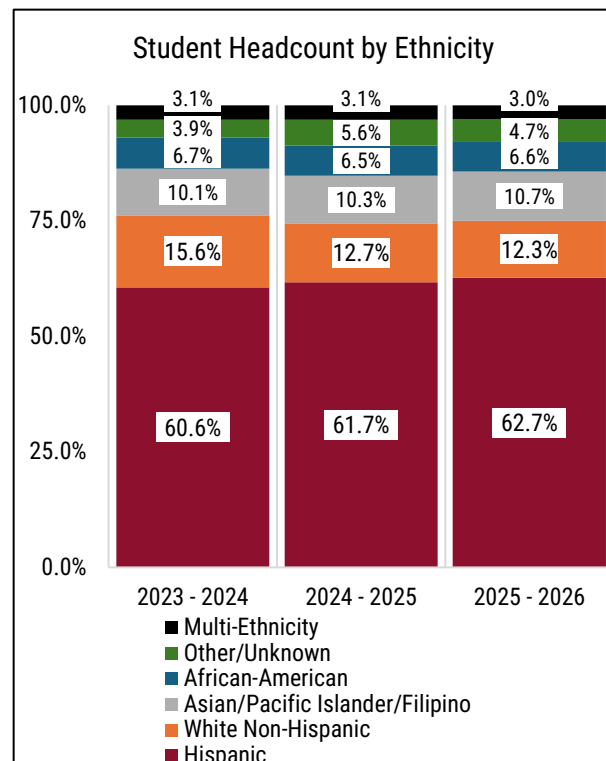
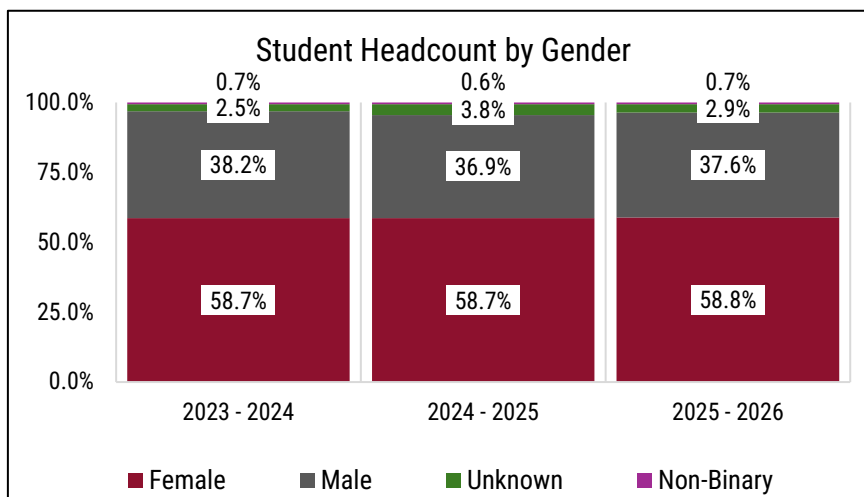


Figure 7: Student Headcount by Gender

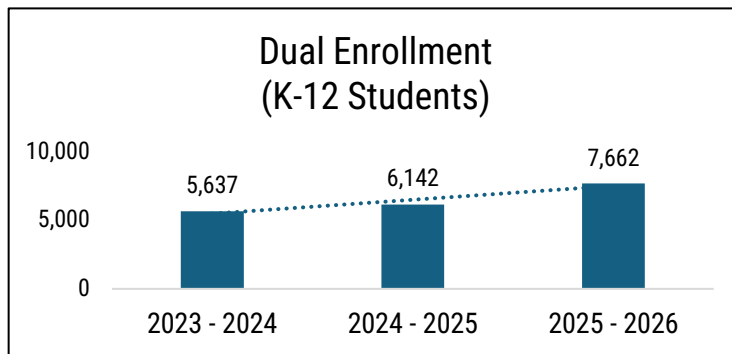
The college served significantly more DSPS, Puente, Umoja and Veteran students.

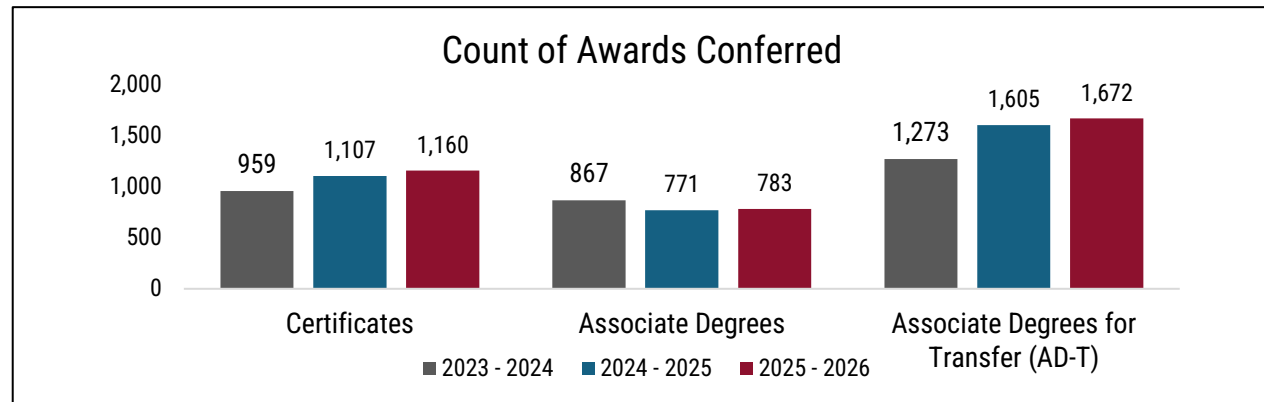

Figure 10: Count of Transfers By Institution Type

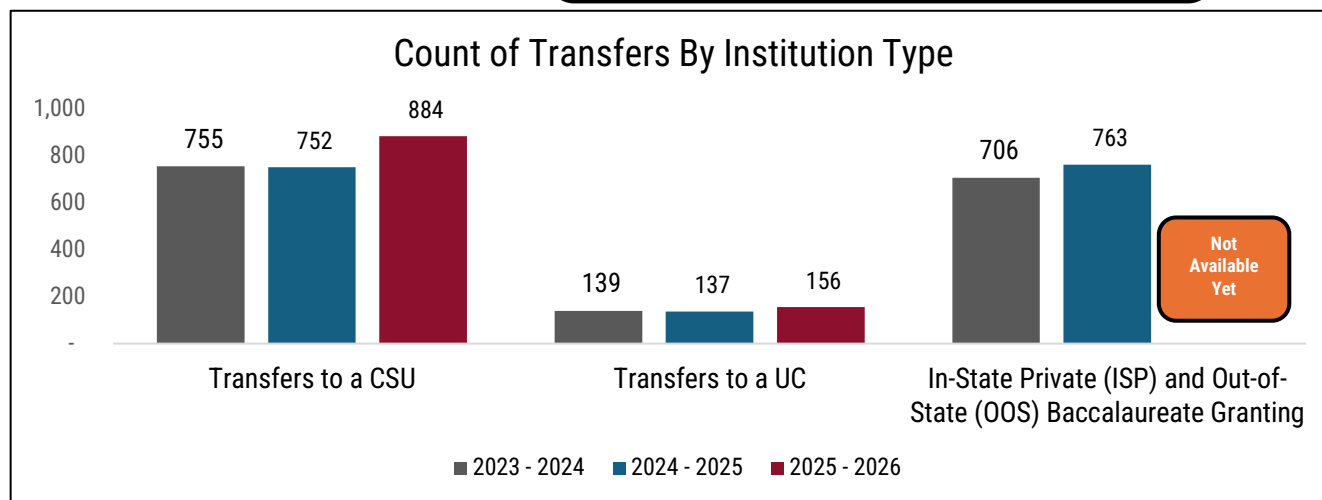

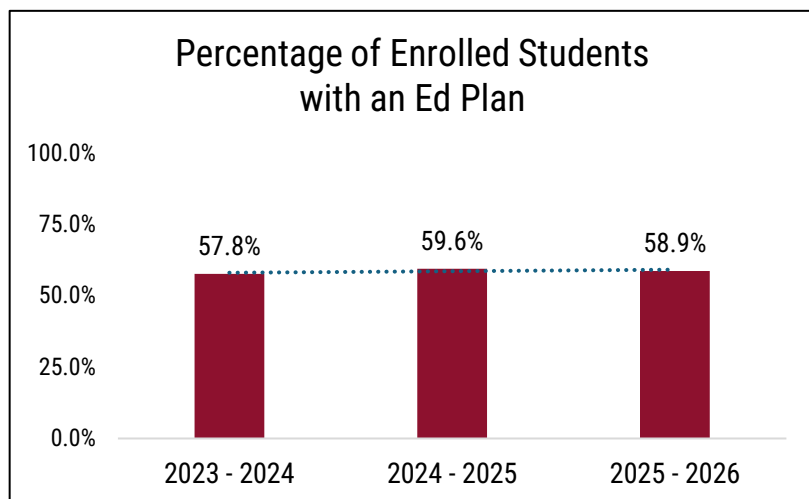

Figure 12: 2025 – 2026 Service Area Map (Headcount)

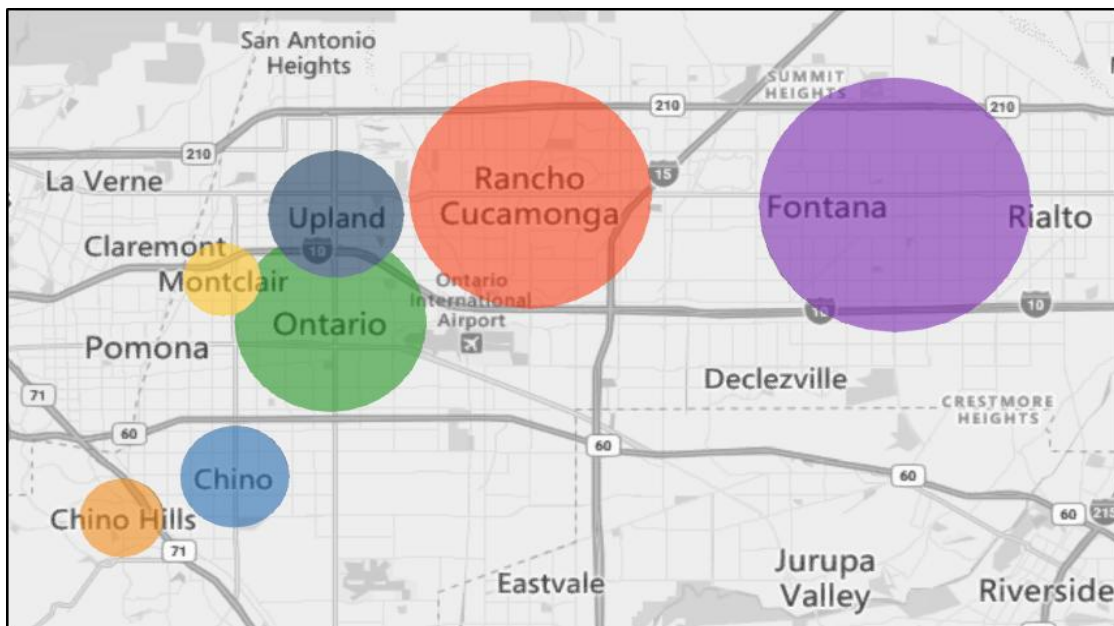

Chino Hills saw a decline in student headcount from the previous year, while most other top service area cities, including Fontana and Rancho Cucamonga, experienced steady growth.

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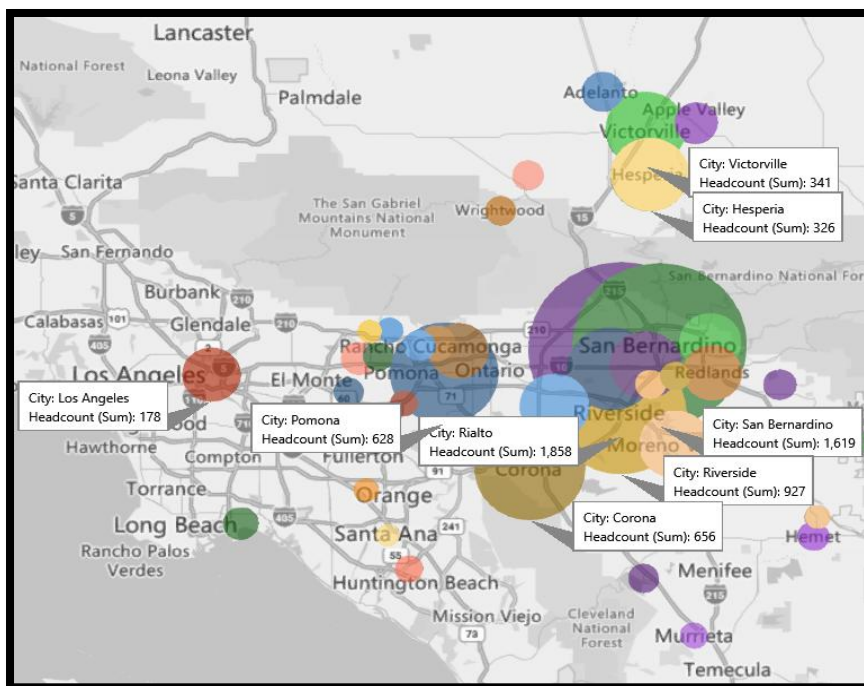
