

- Do not use terms like "alien" or "illegal immigration."

Have or previously had deferred action for

childhood arrivals (DACA)

- Do all you can to identify yourself as an ally/supporter; use posters, bookmarks, and stickers to make your support visible.
- Do not ask undocumented students to self-identify.
