Motivated by honest conversations and a belief that everyone and everything has a story, Yvette M. Pino harnesses her artistic ability to interpret these narratives. While deployed to Iraq in 2003 with the 101st Airborne Division, she was tasked to paint murals and was coined the unofficial "Division Artist." Painting in the field often encouraged discussions between artist and audience and would fundamentally influence Pino's creation of The Veteran Print Project. Over the last 10 years the Veteran Print Project has paired more than 100 veterans with artists to exchange a dialogue that resulted in an edition of prints based on the veteran's story. Join us to learn about Pino's creative practice and her experiences collaborating with veteran artists. The faculty portion of the workshop will focus on how faculty can apply storytelling and printmaking as a way to engage students in sharing their stories and connecting the curriculum to students' backgrounds.
